| Field | Value | Field | Value |
|---------------|--|-----------------|--|
| Name | The name of the company. | Daily Low | The lowest price the stock has traded at so far today |
| Last Price | The price of the stock when it was last traded. | Previous Close | The stock's price at the end of the previous trading day |
| Trade Time | The time the stock was last traded. | Hist Close Date | The date of the stock's previous trading day. |
| Trade Date | The date the stock was last traded. | Currency | In the US the currency is US Dollars. |
| Net Change | The increase or decrease in the stock's price between today's last price and the closing price of the previous trading day. | Exchange | The exchange the stock trades on. |
| % Change | The percentage of increase or decrease in the stock's price between today's last price and the closing price of the previous trading day | Yield | Yield is calculated as Annual Dividend (iad) / Previous Day Close Price) * 100. |
| Volume | The total number of shares traded so far today. | Earnings | A company's profit or earnings divided equally among all the shares investors own. |
| Bid | The highest price a buyer is willing to pay for the stock. | Dividend | Payments to shareholders that some stocks provide. Not all stocks offer dividends. |
| Bid Size | The number of shares offered for sale. | Dividend Date | The payment date of the dividend. |
| Ask | The price the seller is willing to accept. | Ex Div Date | The date on which the shareholder must own the stock in order to receive a dividend payment. |
| Ask Size | The number of shares available to buy. | P.E | A company's closing price divided by its latest annual earnings per share. |
| Opening Price | The price of the stock when it first traded today. | Year's High | This is the highest price of the stock within 52 weeks. |
| Daily High | The highest price the stock has traded at so far today. | Year's Low | This is the lowest price of the stock within 52 weeks. |
