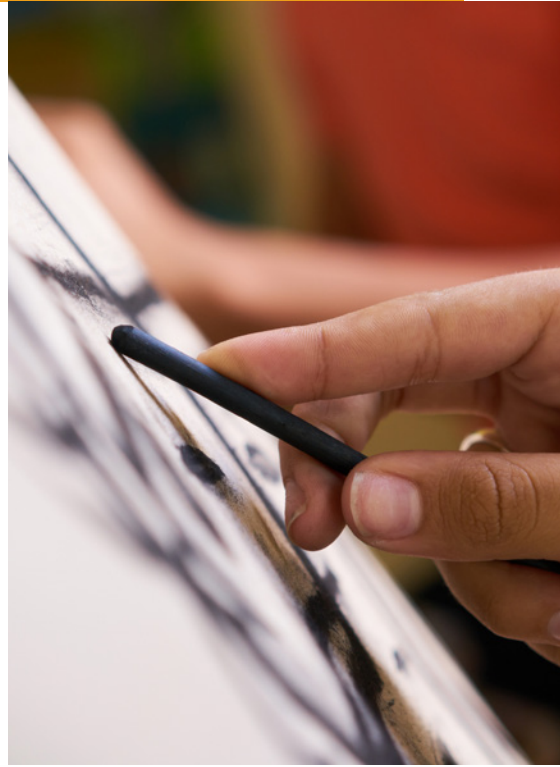

Parking Policy

Photograph/Video Release

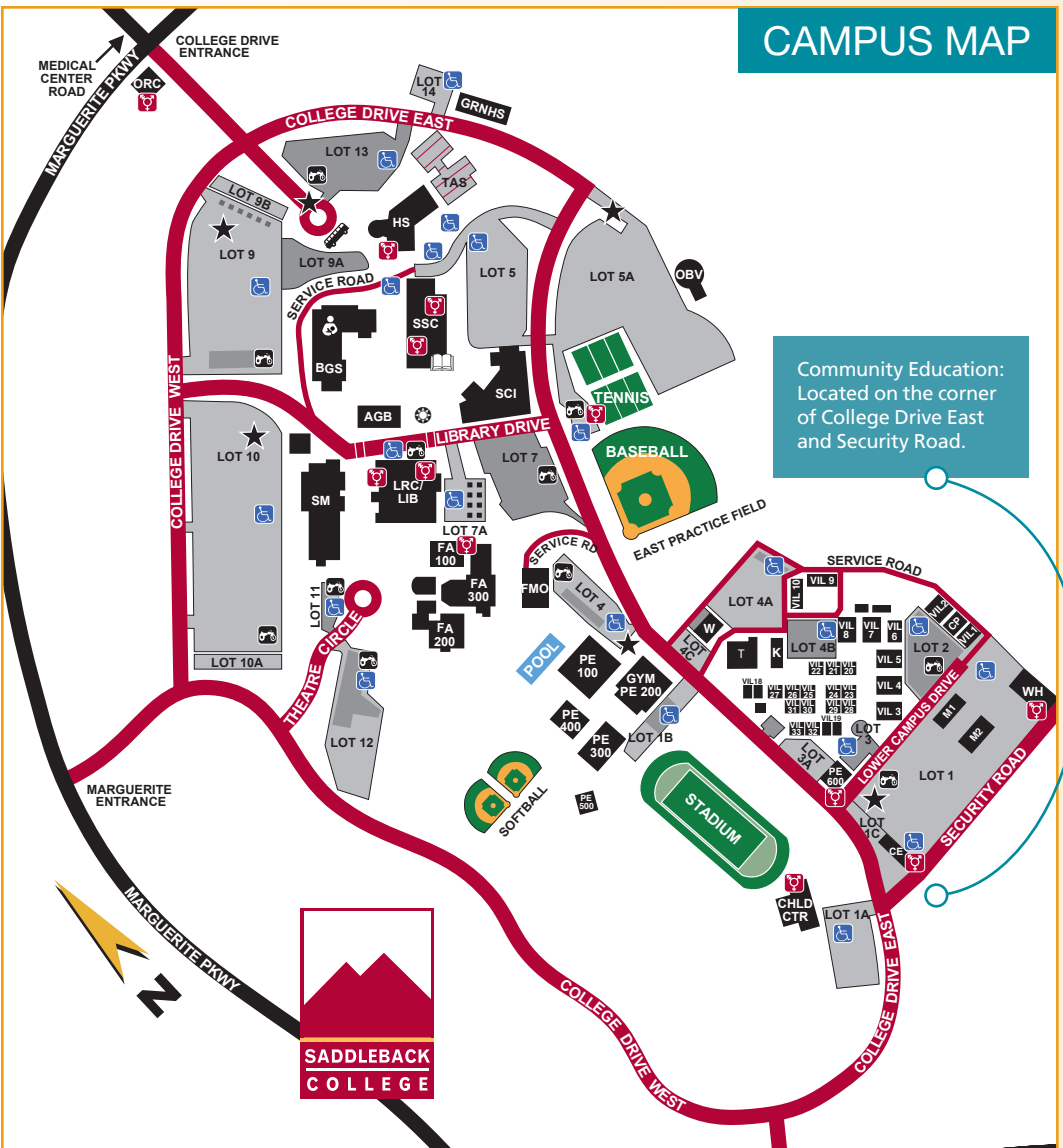
