College Board Opportunity Scholarships

- College Board is committing \$25 million in scholarships over the next five years.
- College Board Opportunity Scholarships launched in December 2018.
- Half of the scholarships are designated for students whose families earn less than \$60,000 per year.
- Students earn chances at scholarships by completing 6 key actions along the path to college. Scholarships are awarded monthly through drawings among all eligible students.

4,000 students each year earn scholarships ranging from \$500 to \$40,000



College Board Opportunity Scholarships

This is a unique scholarship program. These scholarships:

- Are open to all juniors and seniors who attend high school in the US or US territories, regardless of GPA, test scores, family income, and citizenship status
- Simplify the college planning process
- Reward effort and action
- Promote practice
- Don't require an application or essay

Over 275,000 students have joined the program so far.





- Student Search Service is effective, it's voluntary, it's free, and it's secure.
- Over 80% of students taking College Board assessments opt in to Student Search Service.
- Recent research shows that students participating and contacted via Student Search Service are 12% more likely than their peers to enroll at a four-year college.

For over 40 years, Student Search Service has connected students with information about college options and scholarship opportunities.



New Pilot for 2019 College List Feature in Student Search Service

- Students often report they need specific and relevant information beyond generic college mailing.
- They want information about majors they are interested in, financial aid and application deadlines.
- This is an expansion of an existing pilot that will create a more integrated and personalized experience for students.

For students who have **opted in to Search** and **created a College List**in BigFuture, their college list will be added to the information about them in Student Search Service.

Connection to Over \$350M in Scholarships

- In 1971 our partnership began with the National Merit Scholarship Corporation.
- In 2015 we welcomed five new scholarship partners.
- In 2016 the Cobell Scholarship was added.
- Since 2017 we added 13 partners for a total of 20 scholarships.





Test Day Experience: Updates

Same-room testing

Students taking the SAT and SAT with Essay may test in the same room, provided their testing time and break schedules align.

Seating changes

Test coordinators may now seat students 3 feet apart, rather than the previous 4 feet, to accommodate access for more students.

Payment changes

Weekend test center staff can be paid via mobile payment instead of check.

Sending SAT Scores Through MyCoalition

- 1. Students will use MyCoalition to apply to Coalition for College Access institutions.
- When they're ready to send their SAT scores, they'll be prompted through MyCoalition to enter their College Board credentials to access their scores.
- 3. From there, they'll follow a series of easy prompts to send their official SAT score reports, all without leaving MyCoalition!

Beginning in summer 2019, students applying to college through the Coalition Application will be able to send official SAT and SAT Subject Test scores to colleges directly through MyCoalition, the Coalition's online platform.



College Admissions Fraud Case: Varsity Blues

- The College Board has and will continue to cooperate with authorities throughout the investigation.
- Test administrators and proctors must follow our policies and procedures. When they don't, we take appropriate action on behalf of students.
- To prevent this abuse of the system, the College Board will ensure students with school-based accommodations test at their home schools whenever possible.

Test Security

The current climate underscores the need for **objective measures** as part of the college admissions process.

We're investing millions of dollars—more than ever in our history—in **test security**, including:

- Producing more test content
- Cell phone policies
- Increasing test center audits

Landscape[™] provides consistent high school and neighborhood information for all applicants to help admissions officers fully consider every student, no matter where they live.





- A way to fully consider all students | Landscape provides consistent high school and neighborhood information for all applicants to help college admissions officers fully consider every student, no matter where they live.
- A collaboration with colleges | Working for three years with admissions officers all over the country, we developed Landscape.
- Adds, doesn't replace | Landscape is just one of the many things that colleges look at when considering an applicant and does not replace the individual information included in an application, such as an applicant's GPA, personal essay, or high school transcript.
- No applicant gets offered or denied admission because of Landscape, only considered |Colleges do not use Landscape to decide who gets in and who doesn't. It simply helps admissions officers give more students from more places a fair look. All colleges that use Landscape agree they will adhere to the Landscape Appropriate Usage Guidelines.



Remind students to sign in to My AP and to enroll in their AP classes with the codes provided by their teachers.

Make sure students understand the new exam registration timeline and fees.

Provide eligible students with information about the AP fee reduction.

Teachers

Ensure that teachers, especially new AP teachers, are aware of the powerful **free** resources available.

Remind teachers to inform students of the new registration timelines and fees.

Share information with teachers about the AP fee reduction eligibility requirements.



Help Students Get Started


- AP teachers provide students with a unique "join code" for each class section.
