winning the jack as East discarded a diamond. West played another diamond, ruffed by South. Next came a club to the ace followed by dummy's last spade. It would not have helped East to ruff, so he discarded another diamond while South ruffed, leaving this position:


Zhao exited with a low club. West won his queen, but had no winning continuation. A diamond would allow South to ruff in hand while discarding dummy's last club, while a trump play would give away his trump winner. Well done!
Note that East could have defeated the contract with a terrific play. He could have ruffed partner's jack of spades and shifted to either a trump or the 10 of clubs. South's ending would have been destroyed!
