Did you know?

- Students can earn up to \$40,000 when they complete key college planning steps through the College Board Opportunity Scholarships.
- AP classes help students prepare for college-level work.
- Students who earn a score of 3 or higher on an AP Exam are more likely to graduate college in four years.
- Historically, students who take the PSAT/NMSQT score higher on the SAT, on average, than those who don't.
- Studying for the SAT on Official SAT Practice for 20 hours is associated with an average score gain of 115 points from the PSAT/NMSQT to the SAT.
- The SAT is accepted by every college in the United States.
- Most students raise their scores when they take the SAT again.
