Exam	Brief Description
*Subject Area Exam (SAE)	 SAEs are exams used to assess the competencies of prospective teachers according to <i>Florida's Sunshine State Standards</i>. There are 47 different FTCE exams: four <i>General Knowledge</i> sub-tests, one <i>Professional Education</i> exam, and 42 <i>Subject Area</i> examinations. Passing the appropriate FTCE exam is considered <u>one</u> part of the requirements for becoming a licensed teacher in Florida.
General Knowledge Test (GK)	 a basic skills test 4 subtests: Essay, English, Math, and Reading
Professional Education Test (PEd)	a test of pedagogy and professional practices
Florida Educator Leadership Exam (FELE)	test for the certification of school-based administrators
