**THIS GUIDE IS DESIGNED AS A QUICK REFERENCE GUIDE TO HELP PARENTS  
AND THE PUBLIC NAVIGATE KEY COMPONENTS OF FLORIDA'S SCHOOL  
REPORT CARDS AND THE MAP AND COMPARE TOOL.**

The Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), requires every state and district to publish report cards that show how the state, district and schools are doing with regard to student achievement and success. These report cards differ in content and format used in previous school report cards produced by the State of Florida. This guide is provided to assist parents and other users with navigating and using Florida's State, District and School Report Cards and the Map and Compare Florida Public Schools Tool.

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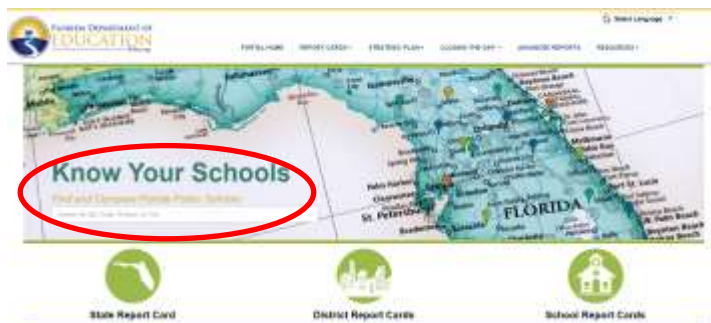

## NAVIGATION



The **Know Your Schools Portal** provides several navigation options that allow you to map and compare Florida public schools and to view report cards. Go to <http://knowyourschoolsfl.org/>.



### Map and Compare Tool:

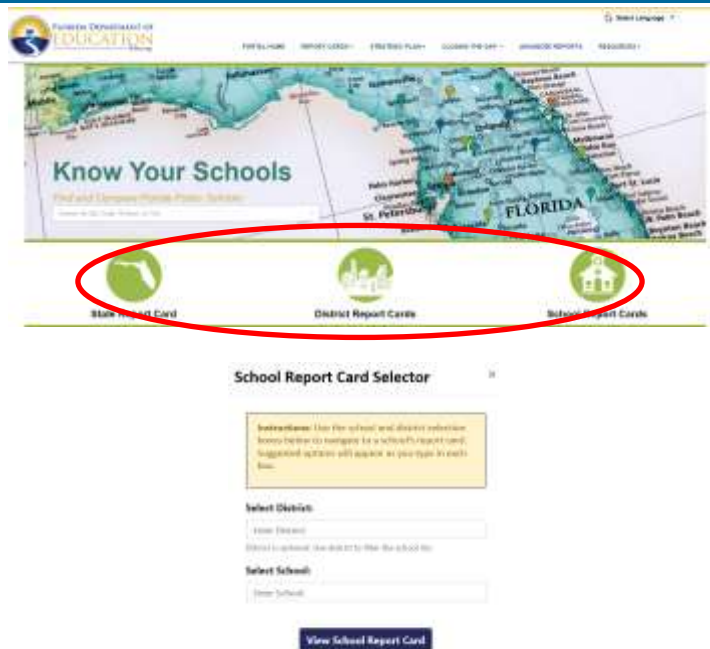
Use the **Map and Compare Tool** to search for schools. Begin by typing a zip code, school name, or city name, and a list of matched options will display. Click the desired item to search.

This option allows you to view the location of schools within a specified radius on a map.

**Note:** The default radius is 5 miles. This can be adjusted up to 25 miles.

You can also filter the schools and compare an overview of information for up to 3 selected schools.

## NAVIGATION

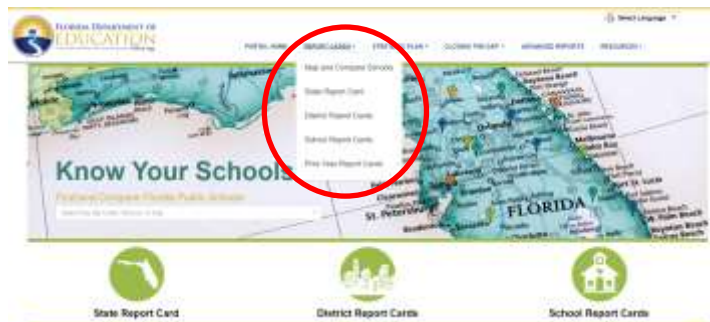


### Navigation Icons:

Use the **State Report Card, District Report Cards, or School Report Cards icons** to go directly to a report card.

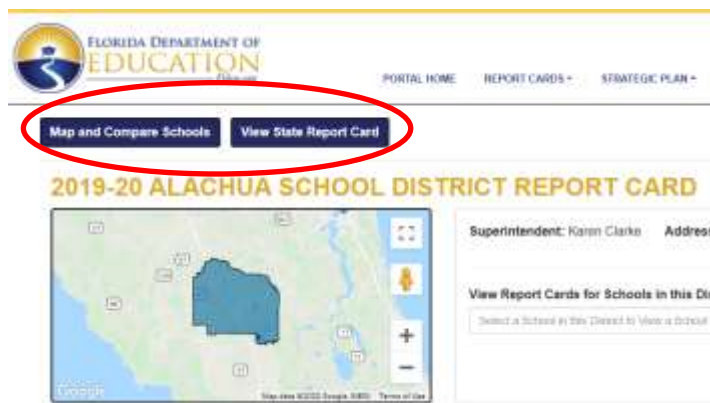
A search box will appear for the School or District Report Cards. You can use the dropdown list or begin typing a district or school name in the corresponding box, and a list of matched districts or schools will display.

Select the district or school name and click the **View Report Card** button.



### Navigation Bar Menu:

From any page within the [Know Your Schools Portal](#), use the Report Cards link in the **top navigation bar** to go to the Map and Compare Tool, State Report Card, District Report Cards, School Report Cards, or Prior Year Report Cards.

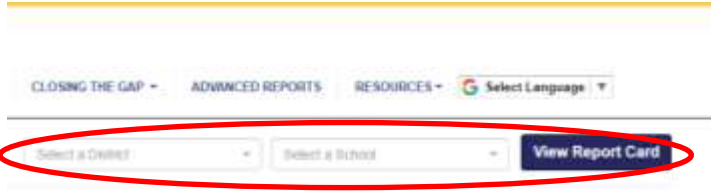


### Navigation Buttons:

From any Report Card, use the **Map and Compare Schools** button to quickly navigate to the **Map and Compare Tool**.

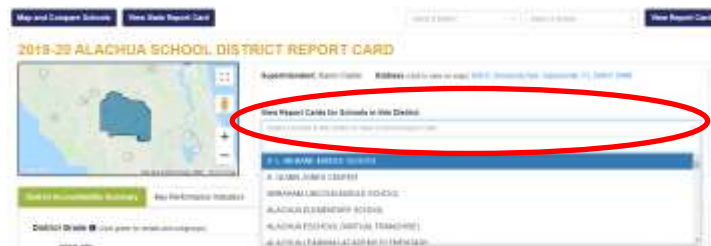
The **View State Report Card** button provides convenient navigation to the State Report Card from District and School Report Cards.

## NAVIGATION



### District and School Selectors:

From each Report Card, you can use the dropdown list or begin typing a district or school name in the corresponding box, and a list of matched districts or schools will display. Click the **View Report Card** button to find the selected District or School Report Card.



### School Dropdown List:

From a District Report Card, use the **View Report Cards for Schools in this District** dropdown list to find schools for the selected district.



### District Name Link:

From a School Report Card, use the district name link to navigate to the District Report Card.

## SPECIAL ICONS



The **information icon** provides additional information about terms or concepts presented in the Report Cards. Click the icon to show an explanation.



As you scroll down a page in the Report Cards, the **Up Arrow** located on the lower lefthand side of the page allows you to quickly jump back to the top of the page.

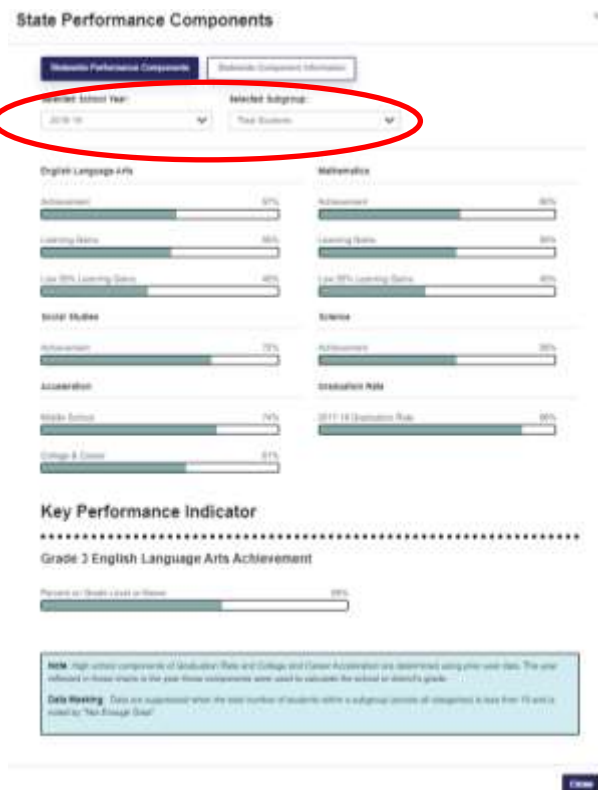


## STATE PERFORMANCE COMPONENTS

## STATE PERFORMANCE COMPONENTS

### State Performance Components

Statewide Performance Components

**Statewide Component Information**

**Four Achievement Components:** The four achievement components are English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies. These components include student performance on statewide, standardized assessments, including the comprehensive assessments and end-of-course (EOC) assessments. The component measures the percentage of full-year enrolled students who achieved a passing score.

**Four Learning Gains Components:** These components are learning gains in English Language Arts and Mathematics, as well as learning gains for the lowest performing 25% of students in English Language Arts and Mathematics. These components include student performance on statewide, standardized assessments including the comprehensive assessments and EOC assessments for the current year and the prior year. The components measure the percentage of full-year enrolled students who achieved a learning gain from the prior year to the current year.

**Middle School Acceleration:** This component is based on the percentage of eligible students who passed a high school level EOC assessment or industry certification.

**College and Career Acceleration:** This component is based on the percentage of graduates from the graduation rate cohort who earned a score on an acceleration exemption (AP IB, or ACE) or a grade in a dual enrollment course that qualified students for college credit or earned an industry verification. College and Career Acceleration is determined using prior-year data. The year reflected in the charts is the year these components were used to calculate the school or district's grade.

**Graduation Rate:** The graduation rate is based on an adjusted cohort of ninth-grade students and measures whether the students graduated within four years. Since graduation rates are calculated at the end of the year, this component is a lag measure and uses the prior year's graduation rate for the current year's school and district grade calculation. The year reflected in the charts is the year these components were used to calculate the school or district's grade.

**Minimum Number of Students for Inclusion in Florida's Accountability System:** A school receives a grade based solely on the components for which it has sufficient data. Sufficient data exists when at least 10 students are eligible for inclusion in the calculation of the component. If a school has less than 10 eligible students with data for a particular component, that component is not calculated in the school's grade. 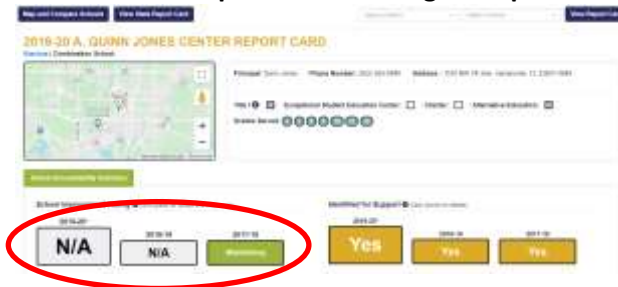


### District and School Report Card Accountability Components:

The school or district's **overall grade or school improvement rating** is displayed in the upper-left quadrant of the report card under the **Accountability Summary** tab.

Click the grade or school improvement rating to see a breakdown of the components that go into the district grade, school grade, or school improvement rating calculation; the district or school subgroup summary; and additional information related to Florida's accountability system.

### School Improvement Rating Example



The breakdown of the components that go into the district grade, school grade, or school improvement rating calculation is available for all students as well as specific subgroups required by ESSA.

Use the dropdown menus to select a different year and/or subgroup to see that specific year and subgroup's performance on each component of the overall grade or rating.

District Grades provide an easily understandable way to measure the performance of a district. Parents and the general public can use the district grade and its components to understand how well each district is serving its students. Districts are graded A, B, C, D, or F, and these grades are calculated for each county-based district.

**A District's Grade May Include up to Eleven Components:** There are four achievement components, four learning gains components, a middle school acceleration component, as well as components for graduation rate and college and career acceleration. Each component is worth up to 100 points in the overall calculation. The number of points earned for each component are added together and divided by the total number of available points to determine the percentage of points earned.

**Four Achievement Components:** The four achievement components are English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies. These components include student performance on statewide standardized assessments, including the comprehensive assessments and end-of-course (EOC) assessments. The component measures the percentage of full-year enrolled students who achieved a passing score.

## ACCORDIONS



The Report Cards contain **subsections** organized by content area accordions. The accordion header has a blue background with white text that can be expanded or collapsed by clicking the text to reveal related charts, tables, and/or details.



Expandable subsections called accordions may contain infographics that provide quick visuals of information, as demonstrated here in the Population and Enrollment accordion.



Accordions contain **tabs** located at the top of each open subsection. These tabs provide specific content related to the subsection. Click the tab title to open the related content. A green tab indicates the current open tab.

## ACCORDIONS




Content tabs may contain a **General Information and Data Notes** section that provides explanations related to the charts and tables, as well as links to additional details.



Content tabs may contain a **Chart Creation** section that allows users to select filters and generate charts that provide a visual representation of the related data.



Charts can be exported using the Chart Content Menu icon  located in the upper-right corner of the chart. A dropdown list provides several chart export options. Click the desired option to export and save the chart.

Click and drag the pegman onto the school pin on the map for a street view of the location.

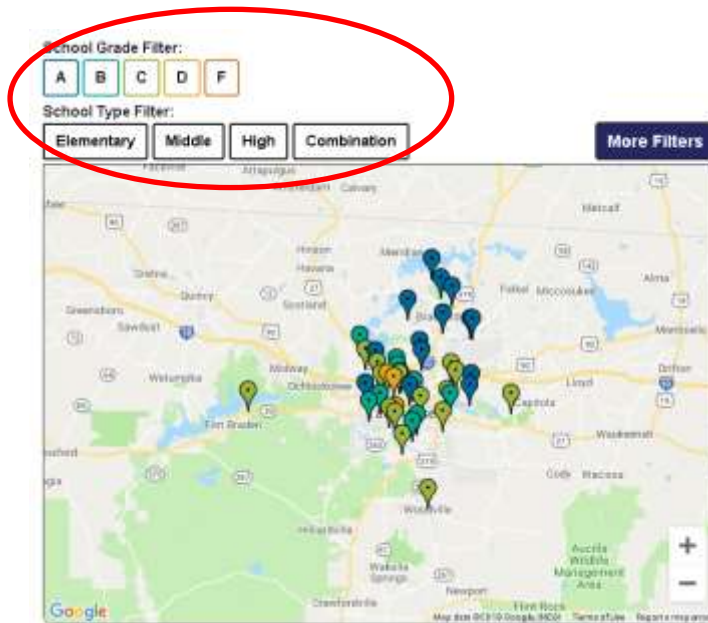
Click the district or school address to compare schools in the **Map and Compare Tool**.

## MAP AND COMPARE PUBLIC SCHOOLS TOOL



The **Map and Compare Tool** allows you to search for schools using the district name. You can include up to 3 districts at once.

Or, you can search by radius from a school, city, or zip code. The default radius is set to 5 miles from the school, city, or zip code selection; however, the user can adjust this distance up to 25 miles using the **distance slider**.



### Map Filters:

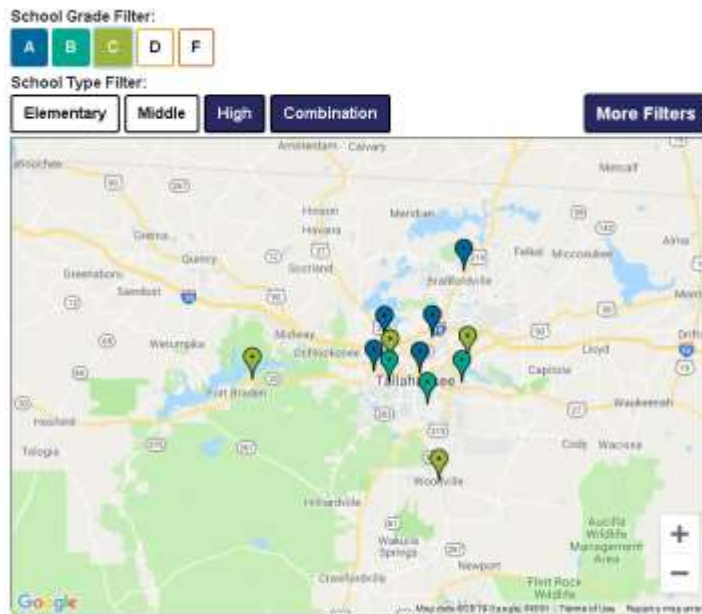
You can filter the displayed schools by using the **school grade or school type filters**.

The default displays all schools that received a school grade in the most recent year and are classified as a K-12 General Education School.

Click the **More Filters** button for additional filter options (see page 16).

**Note:** Filter buttons are not filled with a color until they are clicked and a filter is applied.

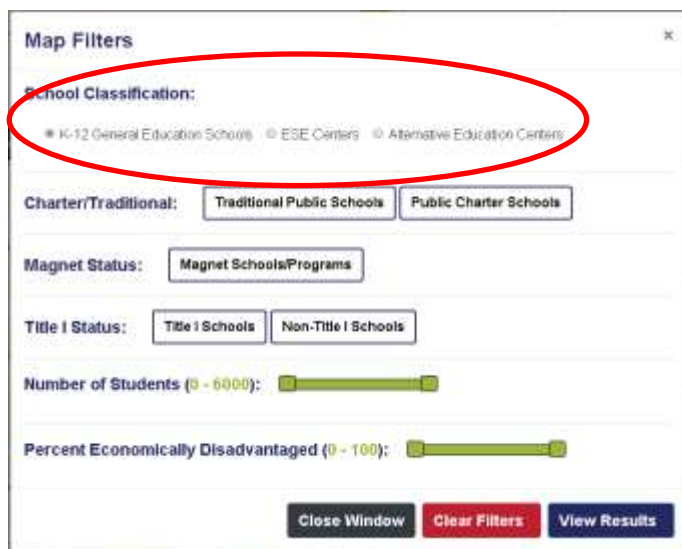
## MAP AND COMPARE PUBLIC SCHOOLS TOOL



Notice that a clicked button within a filter category applies the selected filter(s) and changes the button's fill color.

Only schools that meet the condition(s) of the colored (filtered) buttons within the filter category are displayed.

If no buttons are selected within a filter category, then no filters are applied for that category.



The **More Filters** button (see page 15) displays additional school filters.

The **School Classification** radio buttons allow you to toggle between K-12 General Education Schools, ESE Centers and Alternative Education Centers within the selected area.

**Note:** The default is set to K-12 General Education Schools.

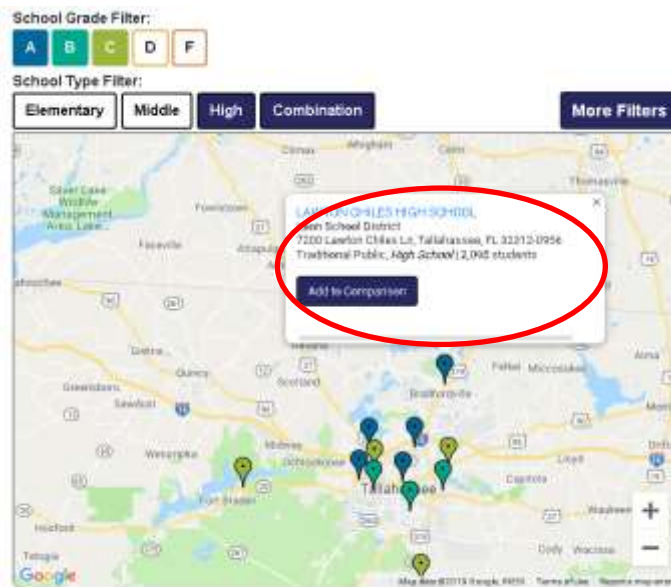

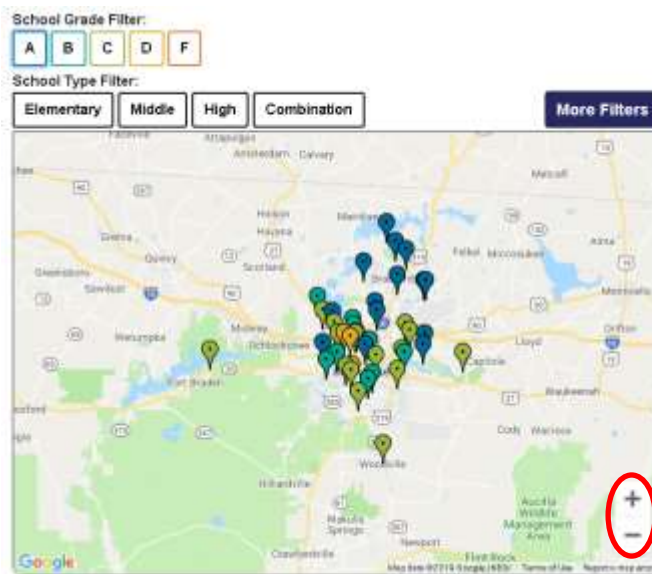

Hover your mouse cursor over the pins/markers in the map to display select information about a school.

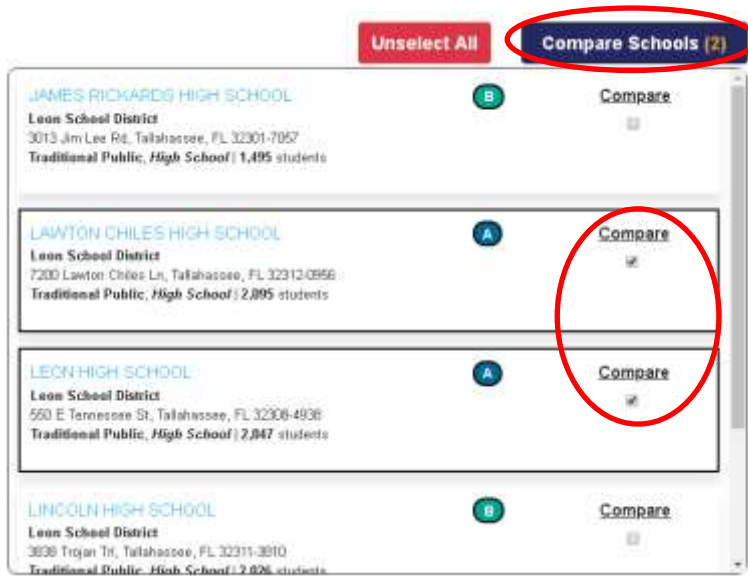
You can use this pop up to add the school to your comparison list, or click the name of the school to go directly to the school's Report Card.



Use the + or - icons located in the lower right-hand corner to adjust the map zoom level.



## MAP AND COMPARE PUBLIC SCHOOLS TOOL



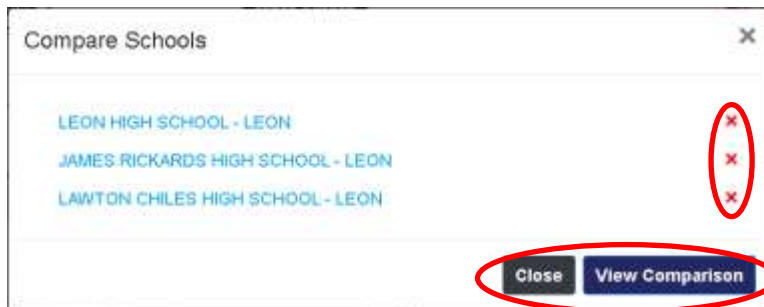
A list of schools will appear on the right side of the Map and Compare page that corresponds to the map and any filters that are applied.

Click the **Compare** check box to add a school to your comparison list.

A count of selected schools will display in the **Compare Schools** button.

Once you have selected the schools for your comparison, click the **Compare Schools** button.

**Note:** You can compare up to 3 schools at one time.



A Compare Schools list will appear where you can:

- 1) Click a corresponding 'X' icon to remove a school from your comparison.
- 2) Click the **Close** button to return to the map and make adjustments.
- 3) Confirm the list is correct and click the **View Comparison** button.



The **View Comparison** button will open a new browser tab containing a side-by-side comparison of key measures for the selected schools.
