But when they walk away, it is my hope and prayer that they would know that they've encountered a Christian, and that my sign of love is clear and authentic. What about your sign?

I don't recall just what we talked about but at the end she gave me a book that she had self-published, Seasons of the Rose, about receiving messages from God. She also learned about the village of Medjugorje in Bosnia-Herzegovina where people were receiving messages from the Virgin Mary. All this created in her a spiritual awakening. She became much more serious about her Catholicism, attending Mass every day, praying the rosary frequently and engaging in deep prayer for other people.



I had seen the garden before, but never noticed the statue. Finally, at the corner Pizza house was a sign "No Loitering!"

Were these signs from God? Who knows, but what I thought after returning home was this: instead of "Hate has no home here" how 'bout if the church put a sign out its front door saying, "Love has a home here!" And because one of the themes at Annual Conference was "Get out the door, reach out to your neighbors", lets put a "no loitering" sign in our pews!
