Only four players in Spurs history have $150 / 150$ in their first 200 games: David Robinson, Tim Duncan, Greg Anderson and DERRICK WHITE ... 2020-21 recorded a single-season career-high 84 three-pointers in 36 games ... set Spurs record for three-pointers in the first quarter with 4 treys in the opening frame on $4 / 19 \ldots$ posted careerhighs of 29 points, 7 three-pointers made and tied a career-best 10 field goals made in a season-high 45 minutes of action vs. Atlanta on $4 / 1$.

The Spurs defense won the game, as they outrebounded the Kings 44-35 and limited the Kings to only 3 second-chance points while they tied a season low four three-pointers made on the offensive end. The Spurs began the series trailing 0-1 after the Kings 132-115 win at the AT\&T Center on 3/29. The second quarter proved to be the turning point as the Kings outscored the Spurs $41-29$ while shooting 75.0 percent from the field compared to San Antonio's 52.0percent. The Spurs tied up the mini-series 1-1 after defeating the Kings 120-106 on 3/31 and are now 7-0 this season when scoring at least 120 points. The Spurs held a 69-53 lead at halftime and shot 53.2 percent from the field, extending their record to $20-5$ when leading at the break.

## SPURS TEAM NOTES

SPURS WINNING HISTORY: San Antonio currently has a $.614(2,230-1,401)$ historical winning percentage - the best in NBA history, the Los Angeles Lakers are second (.595). The Spurs own an all-time winning record against 28 of 29 teams in the NBA ( $88-88$ against Portland). 12/3/19 marked the 3,500th game played in Spurs NBA history since the team joined the league in 1976.

HOMECOMING: The Spurs are 23-2 in season home openers under head coach Gregg Popovich. His 92 percent winning percentage is the best of any coach in the NBA (min. 10 games). San Antonio has kicked off 23 of their 25 seasons under Coach Pop at the Alamodome and AT\&T Center with a win.

- Spurs now have 34 wins in season-openers since joining the NBA in 1976 - the most of any team in the league since the ABA-NBA merger in 1976.
- In the Spurs Season opener, Devin Vassell scored his then career-high 19 points on a career-high 8 made baskets. He also dished a career-high 5 assists on a night AT\&T Center welcomed fans at full capacity.

MILESTONE MARK: Popovich recorded his 1,300 th career win on $3 / 27$ vs. Sacramento (120-106) and is the fastest coach to reach 1,300 win in NBA history by over four full season, 356 games. He posted his 1,250 th victory on $11 / 7$ vs. Oklahoma City (121-112). Popovich moved into third on the NBA's all-time wins list with the Spurs 154-147 win over Oklahoma City on $1 / 10 / 19$ and was the fastest NBA coach to reach 1,200 career wins. *Denotes active coach

YOUTH MOVEMENT: The Spurs have their youngest roster ever since Gregg Popovich became coach in 1996, with an average age of 24.5 . The roster this season includes eight players under the age of 25 and 13-of-17 players under the age of 27. The next youngest teams: 2020-21 (25.5) and 2019-20 (26.3).

- Spurs guard Josh Primo is the youngest player in league history to appear in an NBA game after going to college (18 years and 300 days). Previous/y: Devin Booker (18-363)
- Primo became the $28^{\text {th }}$ player in NBA history to appear in a game at the age of 18 . He is the 14 th-youngest player - just three days younger than LeBron James was when he made his debut in 2003.

- The Spurs average the second-most assists in the NBA, handing out 27.8 per game and have recorded 278 total assists through 10 games.
- Dejounte Murray is averaging 8.3 assists, good for No. 5 in the NBA.

BACKCOURT DUO: The Spurs young guards Dejounte Murray and Derrick White have shown progress and created a bigger impact on the team this. Here is their year-by-year comparison:

- The Spurs went 17-12 last season with White and Murray in the starting lineup.
- Derrick White reached both 150 steals and 150 blocks in his career on 10/28. Only four players in Spurs history have 150/150 in their first 200 games: David Robinson, Tim Duncan, Greg Anderson and DERRICK WHITE.

BLOCKOB: Jakob Poeltl ranks No. 12 in franchise history with 294 blocks and looks to jump No. 11 Greg Anderson (317) next on the list.

- He broke his single season-career high with 123 last year, becoming the 14th player in Spurs history to reach 100 blocks in a single season and the first Spur not named Tim Duncan with 120+ blocks since Rasho Nesterovich (2003-04).

TOP VETERANS: Among active NBA players, Thaddeus Young is one of five players to record at least 12,000 points, 5,000 rebounds, 1,600 assists and 1,400 steals in his career.

- Young currently sits seventh among active players with 1489 steals and looks to jump No. six Rajon Rondo (1494) next on the list.
- Young has made 5,851 career field goals, placing him 12th in the league while shooting .502, which is good for 27 th.
- He ranks No. 9 in the NBA with 2,111 career offensive rebounds and 17th among active players in total rebounds with 6,167 .
- His fifth steal vs. NYK (02/03) tied him with Tim Hardaway for 54 th on the NBA's All-Time Steals list with 1,428 . Currently, he sits at No. 50 with 1,489 career steals.

MCBUCKETS: Doug McDermott knocked down a career-high 7 three-pointers against Milwaukee on 10/23, the second-most three-pointers made in a game this season (8). On the season, McDermott is shooting .455 beyond the arc.

- Over the last four seasons, he as only posted one sub-40 3-point percentage.
- McDermott is one of only eight active players in the NBA with more than 600 three-pointers while shooting at least . 400 from beyond the arc.
- Doug McDermott is one of 10 players in the NBA to make over 100 three-pointers while shooting over . 500 from the field last year.
- As a career . 408 three-point shooter, he owns the ninth spot on the NBA All-Time 3FG\% list among active players.

RISING TALENT: Bryn Forbes now has 30 games with 4+ three-pointers for the Spurs. Only four players in franchise history have more; Manu Ginobili (90), Danny Green (70), Patty Mills (70) and Chuck Person (40).

- A career . 412 (595-1442) shooter from three-point range, Forbes sits at No. eight among active players in the NBA.

- Bryn Forbes was one of three players in the league to make more than 150 threepointers while shooting at least 45 percent last season.
- Forbes notched the third-most three-pointers made by a Spur through his first three seasons with 282.
- He is one of seven Spurs to record 700 points during the 2019-20 season (707) and became just the 10th undrafted player in NBA history to record 250-or-more three-pointers through his first three career seasons.
- Forbes joined Avery Johnson and Bruce Bowen as the only undrafted players in Spurs history to start 80-plus games in a single season.

TRIPLE-DOUBLE KING: Murray recorded the fifth triple-double of his career with 21 points, 12 rebounds and career-
high 15 assists on 10/26, marking the 48th total triple-double in San Antonio franchise history.

- He is only one of four Spurs to have 5+ triple-doubles.
- He posted his second 20-point triple-double. Only two players in Spurs history have more 20/10/10 games: David Robinson (13) and Alvin Robertson (3).
- Only three players in franchise history have recorded 4+ triple-doubles in single season: Johnny Moore (5) 198485; David Robinson (4) 1993-94; Dejounte Murray (4) 2020-21. Murray posted his fourth triple-double of 2020-21 with 22 points, 10 rebounds and matched his career-high 11 assists on 4/28/21.

- He was the first Spur to have multiple triple-doubles in the same season since David Robinson in 1993-94 (4) with 11 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists on $1 / 24 / 21$.
- Became the 14th player in Spurs history to record a triple-double with his first career triple-double (11 points,10 rebounds, 10 assists) in the Spurs home-opener on 12/26/20.
- Only five Spurs have recorded a triple double under Popovich since 1996: Tim Duncan, Tony Parker, Pau Gasol, DeMar DeRozan, Dejounte Murray.
- Spurs are now 36-11 all time when a player posts a triple double.

BY THE NUMBERS: The Spurs recorded 32 assists in their home opener against Orlando (W, 123-97) and are 172-15 under Gregg Popovich when they dish out 30+ assists as a team.

- The Spurs rank second in assists (27.8) and sixth in steals (9.3) in the NBA
- The Spurs rank fourth in the NBA in opponent turnovers. The Spurs are forcing 17.4 turnovers per game, including 9.3 steals, which sits at number seven.
- Last season, San Antonio opponents averaged 15.7 free throws made, marking the 8th fewest free throws allowed in a season in Spurs history.
- Set a franchise record for games with 10 or less turnovers in a single season with 40, beating out the previous record of 34 during the 2008-09 season. Here's where the Spurs rank in the NBA (updated on gameday):

THREE-BALL: The Spurs are averaging 9.4 three-point field goals for the second-highest single-season average behind the 2019-20 season (10.7).

- During the 2019-20 season, the Spurs recorded a franchise single-season record with 9 games of 15+ made three-points. In 2020-21 they recorded 8 such games, with the most recent coming on $5 / 10 / 21$ when the Spurs hit 17 in a dominating 145-125 win vs. Milwaukee.
- The Spurs made 716 threes last season, which ranks fourth in Spurs franchise history with the record for threes made in a single season at 812.

GUARDS ON THE GLASS: On 11/5, Derrick White pulled down a career-high 10 rebounds and Dejounte Murray grabbed 11, marking the first time in Spurs history two players listed at 6'5 or shorter recorded $10+$ rebounds in a regular season game.

- Dejounte Murray (8.1) ranks fourth and Keldon Johnson ranks 16 (5.8) in rebounds among NBA guards.
- In 20-21, they each had five double-digit rebound games through the first 20 games, which is tied for the second-most such games by a Spurs guard in any season in franchise history (George Gervin, 1976-77).
- Here are the top 5 guards in Spurs history for games with 10-or-more rebounds: No. 1 Alvin Robertson (37), No. 2 Dejounte Murray (31), No. 3 George Gervin (30), No. 4 Keldon Johnson (12), TNo. 5 DeMar DeRozan and Manu Ginobili (10).


## SPURS 2020-21 SEASON SNAPSHOT

1000+ CLUB: Keldon Johnson reached 1,000 career points on $5 / 13 / 21$, becoming the fifth-fastest Spur to score 1,000 points following David Robinson, Tim Duncan, Walter Berry and Willie Anderson. At 21 years old, he is also the third youngest Spur to reach the threshold: Tony Parker and Mark Olberding.

- Dejounte Murray recorded his first 1,000 -point season on $5 / 10 / 21$. The last point guard to score $1,000+$ points in a season for the Spurs not named Tony Parker is Avery Johnson in 1995-96

HISTORIC HALF: The Spurs set a new franchise record for most points in the first half by scoring 87 points against the Bucks on $5 / 10 / 21$, beating out the previous mark of 84 points versus Denver in 1984. It also stands as the second-highest scoring of any half in franchise history and is only topped by the Spurs 91 points in the second half at Denver in 1984.

- The Spurs put up 45 points in the first quarter, the fourth-highest scoring first quarter in franchise history with the record being 47 vs. Denver in 1993.
- San Antonio matched the franchise record for most three-pointers made in any half with 12

LIGHTS-OUT SHOOTING: On $5 / 10 / 21$, the Spurs recorded a 145-125 win over Milwaukee for their highest scoring regulation win since posting a 147-116 win versus the Warriors on 3/19/2010.

- San Antonio has recorded 17 games in franchise history with $145+$ points in regulation, the Spurs 59.6 field goal percentage ( $56-94$ ) ranks ninth and the 58.6 threepoint shooting (17-29) ranks third among those games.

ROAD WARRIORS: The Spurs clinched a winning road record last season with a $113-104$ win at Sacramento on $5 / 7 / 21$ and own the most seasons with a winning record on the road since 1997 with 21 seasons. Tied for second is the Thunder, Mavericks and Lakers with 12 then the Heat and Rockets at 10.

- The Spurs posted a .528 road win-percentage with a 19-17 record last season. San Antonio's season-best road percentage is 732 after posting $30-11$ records in 201617 and 2013-14, which also is tied for the 17th best mark in the league since 1985.
- From 2000-01 to 2020-21, San Antonio owns the most road wins in the NBA with 489 (No. 2 Dallas - 440; No. 3 Houston - 412).

PROTECT THE BALL: In 2020-21, the Spurs averaged 11.4 turnovers for the lowest single-season average in team history.

- The Spurs only had 821 turnovers as a team, which ranked second in the NBA behind only Portland (799) and is the fewest total turnovers in Spurs history in a nonlockout season (more than 50 games).

OVERTIME THRILLERS: The Spurs played seven overtime games for the second most in franchise history after the 1983-84 season with 8 OT games.

- The Spurs seven games tied for the most by any team this year with Phoenix and Indiana. San Antonio tied with Denver and Phoenix for most minutes played last
- From the 2018-19 to 2020-21, the Spurs have played 17 OT games for the third most in the NBA: No. 1 Brooklyn (19), No. 2 Minnesota (18).

SPREADING THE WEALTH: The Spurs had 13 different leading scorers in last season, which is tied for the second most leaders in franchise history. The franchise recorded for leading scorers is 15 different players set during the 2017-18 season.

- Here are the top six seasons: 2017-18 (15 players), 1986-87 (13), 2014-15 (13), 2020-21 (13), 1988-89 (12), 2012-13 (12).

ROOKIE CORNER: As a rookie, Devin Vassell knocked down the sixth-most threes by a rookie in Spurs history with 52 (No. 5 Beno Udrih - 58; No. 6 Devin Vassell - 52; Manu Ginobili - 51), while only playing 1,056 minutes, which ranks 24th among Spurs rookies (No. 23 Beno Udrih 1,149).

- Recorded 18 blocks last year, tied for the sixth-most by a Spurs rookie guard along with Anthony Jones.
- Only the second Spur in history to record 30+ three-pointers and 30+ steals in their first 30 career games, joining Tony Parker.
- Vassell scored 279 points for the 13th most by a Spurs rookie off the bench.

NIGHT IN BOSTON: On 4/30/21, the Spurs led the Celtics 77-48 at halftime, San Antonio's largest lead at the break in Boston ever, previously 24 in 1999 . San Antonio has only scored more points in the first half six times ever in franchise history.

- Spurs had played 3,610 games in franchise history and only had 11 larger halftime leads than their 77-48 margin at Boston.
- Spurs won the first quarter by 23 points (39-16), San Antonio's largest lead after one since at Chicago in March of 2014 and is just two points shy of the team's largest lead ever after one - 25 at Golden State in Nov. 1999.

BIG BODY: Keldon Johnson scored 23 points and grabbed 21 rebounds, including 11 offensive boards on 3/19/21 in the Spurs 116-110 win at Cleveland.
Johnson is the first Spur with a game of $20+$ points and $20+$ rebounds with $10+$ offensive boards since Tim Duncan in 2010.

- There have only been 6 games (by 3 players) in NBA history where a player $6^{\prime} 5^{\prime \prime}$ or shorter has had $20+$ points and $20+$ rebounds. Johnson posts the 7 th game and becomes the 4th player ever (Fat Lever (4), Russell Westbrook, Shai Gilgeous-Alexander) to accomplish the feat.
- He is the first Spurs to record 21 rebounds since Tim Duncan (12/2/13) and is the second-youngest Spurs to grab 21 boards ( 21 years, 159 days) since DeJuan Blair did so twice in 2010 ( 20 years, 266 days).
- Johnson is the 14th Spurs player in franchise history to grab 20+ rebounds and is tied with five players for one-career game.

2021 RISING STARS ROSTER: Keldon Johnson is the first Spurs player to be selected for the Rising Stars Challenge since Jonathon Simmons in 2017 and is the first player to be selected in his second season after appearing in less than 20 games as a rookie since Clint Capela in 2016.

- Johnson becomes the ninth player in San Antonio franchise history to be selected to the Rising Stars since the event's inception in 1994.

VERY VASSELL: Devin Vassell posted a streak of 11 games with $1+$ steals and 0 turnovers, marking the longest streak all-time in NBA history.

- Last season Vassell tallied 43 steals for the seventh-most among Spurs rookies since 1990: No. 4 Tim Duncan (55), No. 5 DeJuan Blair (50), No. 6 George Hill (45), No. 7 Devin Vassell (44).

NOTABLE NIGHT: The Spurs defeated the Trail Blazers 125-104 on 1/18/21 behind several individual and team milestones.

- Dejounte Murray became the first Spur in franchise history with 200 points/100 rebounds/70 assists through the first 14 games of any season.
- Spurs totaled 33 assists as a team, led by DeMar DeRozan (11) and Dejounte Murray (11). It was the first time the Spurs had multiple players with 10+ assists in a game since 1996 (Nov. 13, 1996: Avery Johnson - 10, Sean Elliott - 11).
- Spurs head coach Gregg Popovich passed Pat Riley for \#8 on the NBA's all-Time wins list

THREE-POINT RANGE: San Antonio tied its franchise record 20 -made three pointers in their 116-113 win over the Clippers on $1 / 5 / 21$. The Spurs followed that up with 16 threes in a, 118-109, win over the Lakers on 1/7/21, marking the second time in franchise history that the Spurs recorded at least 15 threes in back-to-back contests.

- The Spurs drained 7 three-pointers in the first quarter against Dallas on $1 / 22 / 21$, the second-most made in any quarter in franchise history.


## SPURS HISTORY

ONCE IN A LIFETIME: Spurs head coach Gregg Popovich is the only NBA coach in history to spend 25-plus years with one franchise. Popovich enters an elite group as one of only 8 coaches in the four major US sports history to have been with one team for 25 years (NBA, NFL, NHL, MLB).

- Popovich coached his 1,900th game at Minnesota on 1/9, becoming the 9th coach in NBA history to reach 1,900 games joining: Lenny Wilkens, Don Nelson, Bill Fitch, Jerry Sloan, Larry Brown, George Karl, Dick Motta and Pat Riley.

CONSISTENT WINNING: With the win on $2 / 13 / 17$ at Indiana, Spurs passed the Utah Jazz to claim the most consecutive winning seasons in NBA history. The Spurs held the second longest active streak of winning seasons across the four major sports behind the New York Yankees (27 since 1993) and finished at 22 after going 3239 during the 2019-20 season. The Spurs owned the fifth longest winning streak in history entering the season behind the New York Yankees (39 from 1926-64), Montreal Canadiens ( 32 from 1951-83), Boston Bruins (29 from 1967-96) and Detroit Red Wings (24 from 1991-16). ## ACQUIRED DOUG McDERMOTT

The Spurs acquired seven-year veteran Doug McDermott, a 2023 second round pick and the right to swap 2026 second round pick with the Indiana Pacers on Aug. 7, 2021. McDermott averaged career highs of 13.6 points, 3.3 rebounds and 1.3 assists in 25.4 minutes while shooting .532 from the floor last season for Indiana. He was one of 10 players in the NBA to make over 100 threepointers while shooting over . 500 from the field last year. McDermott is also one of only nine active players in the NBA with more than 600 three-pointers while shooting at least .400 from beyond the arc.

## SIGNED ZACH COLLINS

The Spurs signed Zach Collins as a free agent on Aug. 11, 2021. The former Gonzaga Bulldog was a selected with the 10th overall pick in the 2017 NBA Draft by the Sacramento Kings, then acquired by Portland in a draft night trade. Collins spent the last four seasons with the Portland Trailblazers and holds career averages of 5.7 points and 4.0 rebounds in 17.5 minutes over 154 games. Prior to missing all of last season due to injury, Collins averaged 7.0 points, 6.3 rebounds and 1.5 assists in 24 minutes un 201920. In his lone season for the Bulldogs, Collins led the West Coast Conference in shooting percentage and blocked shots and helped guide Gonzaga to its first NCAA Championship Game in school history.

## ACQUIRED THADDEUS YOUNG

The Spurs acquired veteran forwards Al-Farouq Aminu, Thaddeus Young, along with a future first round pick, a 2022 second round pick and a 2025 second round pick on Aug. 11, 2021. A 14-year-veteran, Young is one of six active players with career totals of at least 13,000 points, 6,000 rebounds and 1,000 steals. He averaged a career-high 4.3 assists to go along with 12.1 points and 6.2 rebounds in 24.3 minutes over 68 games for Chicago last season. Originally selected with the 12th overall pick in the 2007 NBA Draft by Philadelphia, the former Georgia Tech Yellow Jacket spent his first seven seasons with the 76ers. Young then spent time with Minnesota, Brooklyn and Indiana before signing with Chicago in 2019. Over his career, he has played 1,033 games with career averages of 13.1 points, 5.9 rebounds and 1.8 assists in 29.9 minutes

## ACQUIRED AL-FAROUQ AMINU

The Spurs acquired veteran forwards Al-Farouq Aminu, Thaddeus Young, along with a future first round pick, a 2022 second round pick and a 2025 second round pick on Aug. 11, 2021.The 11 -year-veteran Aminu split last season playing for Chicago and the Orlando Magic, averaging 4.4 points and 4.8 rebounds in 18.9 minutes. Originally selected with the eighth overall pick in the 2010 NBA Draft by the Los Angeles Clippers, the former Wake Forest Demon Deacon has played for six teams in his 11-year career. Aminu holds career averages of 7.5 points, 6.0 rebounds and 1.2 assists in 24.9 minutes over 711 total games

## SIGNED JOCK LANDALE

San Antonio signed Jock Landale as a free agent on Aug. 20, 2021. Landale recently helped Australia win their first-ever Olympic medal in men's basketball when they earned bronze at the 2020 Olympic Games. Landale averaged 12.8 points, 4.7 rebounds and 2.2 assists in 21.5 minutes for the Boomers in Tokyo. Originally from Melbourne, Landale spent last season with Melbourne United where he averaged 16.4 points, 7.8 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 1.34 blocks to help the team win the 2021 NBL Championship. Landale was named the NBL Grand Final MVP. He also spent 2018-19 with Partizan in Serbia and 2019-20 with Zalgiris in Lithuania after spending four years at Saint Mary's College of California, where he averaged 13.2 points and 6.7 rebounds in his career and was named the West Coast Conference Player of the Year (2018).

## RE-SIGNED BRYN FORBES

Forbes re-signed with the Spurs on Aug. 25, 2021. He spent the first four years of his career with the Spurs and returns to San Antonio after helping the Milwaukee Bucks win the 2021 NBA Championship last season. In his lone year in Milwaukee, he averaged 10.0 points and 1.6 rebounds in 19.3 minutes while shooting .452 from three-point range, which ranked fourth in the NBA. In four years with the Spurs, Forbes averaged 8.9 points, 1.9 rebounds and 1.5 assists in 21.7 minutes over 261 games, including 155
starts. Forbes was one of three players in the league to make over 150 three-pointers while shooting at least 45 percent last season. In five career seasons, Forbes has made 584 three-pointers while shooting .412 from long range. Since Forbes entered the NBA in 2016, only 10 players in the league have hit more threes while shooting at least 40 percent from beyond the arc.

## DRAFTED JOSH PRIMO

Primo was selected in the first round of the 2021 NBA Draft (12th overall). He suited up for the Spurs in the 2021 NBA Summer League in both Salt Lake City and Las Vegas, appearing in four games and averaged 14.3 points, 2.8 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 1.3 blocks in 25.2 minutes. Last year, Primo earned All-Freshman Team honors at The University of Alabama, averaging 8.1 points and 3.4 rebounds per game while shooting 43.1 percent from the field and 38.1 percent from beyond the arc, helping Alabama to an SEC Tournament win and advance to the Sweet Sixteen in the NCAA Tournament. Native to Ontario, he represented Canada at the 2019 FIBA U-19 Basketball World Cup in Greece, where he was the youngest player on the team at 16.

## DRAFTED JOE WIESKAMP

Selected in the second round of the 2021 NBA Draft (41st overall), Wieskamp signed a two-way contract on 9/7. He played in all eight Spurs 2021 Summer League games, including five in Las Vegas, averaging 10.4 points, and 5.6 rebounds in 23.4 rebounds. The former Iowa Hawkeye is the first junior in school history with 1,250 points, 550 rebounds, 175 three-pointers, 110 assists and 75 steals. In 2020-21, he was the only player in the country with $400+$ points, $200+$ rebounds, $70+3$-pointers, and 25+ steals. Wieskamp earned All-Big 10 Second Team honors and one of five finalists for the 2021 Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award. Wieskamp started all 97 games at Iowa, averaging 13.2 points, 5.8 rebounds and 1.5 assists in 29.8 minutes, shooting 41.2 percent from beyond the arc. He ranks ninth in Iowa career three-pointers made (181). His 46.2 percent 3-point shooting in 202021 is second best, and his 73 triples are fifth most by a junior in program history.
