Findings

N = 72 Respondents

- AY2016-2017 - 11 respondents
- AY2015-2016 – 30 respondents

Category 1: Learner and Learning (InTASC Category 1; CAEP 1.3, 1.4, 4.2, 4.3 - and 4.4 (IP))

Eight items of the survey addressed Category 1: Learner and Learning. At least 92% and up to 98.61% of the initial program completers responded *strongly agree* to *agree* to 5 of the 8 items. Specifically, 98.61% of respondents (n = 71) were favorable to the following item:

- Prepared to establish a caring relationship with students through engagement and high expectations for all learners.

Other items with a majority of favorable responses:

- Prepared to understand how to provide a variety of opportunities that support student learning and development (n = 69, 95.84%)
- Prepared to establish a classroom environment of respect and rapport that provides a culture for learning (68, 94.45%)
- Prepared to understand how students learn and develop (n = 68, 94.45%)
- Prepared to create an environment that encourages positive social interaction among students (n = 66, 92.96%)

Items, although rated favorably by a majority of respondents, that faculty may want to pay closer attention to when considering program improvement:

- Prepared to understand and use knowledge of school, family, cultural and community factors that influence the quality of education for students (n = 61, 84.72%)
- Prepared to effectively teach students from diverse backgrounds (n = 54, 76.06%)
- Prepared to manage student behavior in the classroom (n = 52, 72.22%)

Category 2: Content (InTASC Category 2; CAEP 1.3, 4.2, 4.3 - and 4.4 (IP))

Three items on the survey were specific to Category 2: Content. Sixty-six (n = 66, 92.96%) of respondents *strongly agreed* or *agreed* that they were prepared to teach the core concepts of their content major. “Prepared to have in-depth content knowledge of my professional field” was also favorably rated (n = 65, 91.55%). As a part of program improvement efforts, the EPP may want to consider the responses to “Prepared to encourage students to see, question, and interpret ideas from diverse perspectives and content areas” as 62, (86.11%) of respondents stated they agreed with the item.

Category 3: Instructional Practices (InTASC Category 3; CAEP 1.2, 1.3, 1.4, 4.2, 4.3 - and 4.4 (IP))

Twelve items were dedicated to Category 3: Instructional Practices.

Highest to lowest rankings when combining *strongly agree* and *agree* ratings.

Well prepared to:

1. use effective communication techniques in order to develop positive learning environments (n = 71, 98.61%)
2. develop lesson plans that align with standard (n = 69, 95.84%)
3. create lesson plans that promote critical thinking of students (n = 69, 95.84%)
4. implement lessons that build on students’ existing knowledge and skills (n = 68, 94.44%)
5. provide student-centered instruction, and provide feedback (n = 66, 92.96%)
6. effectively use questioning skills to promote high thinking skills of students (n = 65, 91.55%)
7. provide feedback to students (n = 64, 90.14%)
8. employ teaching skills that reflect theory and evidence-based practices (n = 63, 87.5%)
9. differentiate instruction (n = 63, 87.5%)
10. employment of appropriate assessment techniques (n = 62, 86.11%)
11. engage in assessment activities to identify areas for student improvement (n = 58, 80.56%)
12. use data to make instructional decisions (n = 49, 68.05%)

Category 4: Professional Responsibility (InTASC Category 4; CAEP 1.2, 1.3, 4.2, 4.3 - and 4.4 (IP))

Eight items on the survey pertained to Category 4: Professional Responsibility.

Highest to lowest rankings when combining *strongly agree* and *agree* ratings.

Well prepared to:

1. employ self-reflection to improve reaching practice (n = 71, 98.61%)
2. positively impact student learning (n = 70, 98.59%)
3. use multiple resources...to aid my growth as an educator (n = 66, 92.96%)
4. collaborate with educational personnel support (n = 64, 90.14%)
5. understand the ethical practices of education (n = 61, 84.72%)
6. communicate with family and community members (n = 56, 78.87%)
7. understand state and federal laws that impact schools (n = 54, 75%)
8. understand the legal practices in education (n= 47, 65.28%)

Technology

Four (4) items were specific to technology use.

Highest to lowest rankings when combining *strongly agree* and *agree* ratings.

Well prepared to:

1. use a variety of media (n = 68, 94.44%)
2. use technology to enhance student learning (n = 68, 94.44%)
3. use technology to enhance their overall professional work (n = 66, 92.96%)
4. provide opportunities for students to utilize technology (n = 65, 91.55%)

Satisfaction

With the exception of 1 of 7 items specific to their program, initial program completers were either *very satisfied* to *satisfied* with their experiences at SVSU.

In rank order from most favorable

1. Intellectually challenged by program (n = 68, 94.44%)
2. Overall quality of instruction in the degree/program (n = 67, 94.37%)
3. Working in diverse school settings (n = 67, 94.37%)
4. Prepared to positively impact P=12+ student learning (n = 66, 92.96%)
5. Field-based experiences (n = 65, 91.55%)
6. Student teaching/practicum (n = 64, 90.14%)

'Understand Special Education' is an area that faculty may want to consider while working on program improvement as 46 (64.79%) of the respondents were satisfied with their preparation on the subject.

Additional Results

When asked, 'what is your **present attitude** toward the SVSU degree/program you completed,' 97.18% (n = 69) responded as either *strongly positive* or *positive*.

When asked about **recommending** SVSU's teacher preparation program to other prospective educators,' 61 (84.17%) stated that *yes*, they would.
