* Drivers are not to drop off children anywhere else other than at the designated "Student Drop-Off Zone."


*Remember that children are to exit from the vehicle using the car door facing the building. Never have a child exit into the parking lot on the opposite side.

*Please do not block the entrance to the school. Allow buses to pass on the right, and keep cars to the left of the entrance. Please make sure enough space is left for cars to exit Overshot.

<u>Jacksonville Elementary 2019/2020</u> Kindergarten Registration



Jacksonville Elementary will be holding its 2019-2020 school year registration on April 1 & 2nd 2019. The appointment day and time will be assigned for your child. An informational packet will be mailed a few weeks before the registration date. This registration is intended for children who will be entering kindergarten in the fall, as well as children who are currently attending kindergarten in private schools but plan to enroll at Jacksonville Elementary for **first grade** for the 2019-2020 school year. Children entering kindergarten next year must be five years of age by September 1, 2019. Children entering first grade must be six years of age by September 1, 2019.

If you will be registering your child or know someone who will be registering a child, please complete/have them complete this form and return it to the school office. Please do not contact the office regarding an appointment. A packet of information (including an appointment date & time) will be sent home approximately one month prior to the registration day. A letter will be enclosed outlining the items needed for the registration.
