### Session Title: Introduction To Public Pension Plans Speaker: Michael W. Spaid, Internal Revenue Service Moderator: Mark D. Shelhammer

Michael defined Public Retirement Systems (aka FICA Replacement Plans) as outlined in IRC 3131(b)(7)(F) and Regulation 31.3121(b)(7)-2. Interestingly, about a quarter of the nation's public employees (mostly local government police, firefighters and teachers are not covered for Social Security.

He went on to explain that the two types of public retirement systems that meet the minimum requirement are defined contribution plan and defined benefit plan. To avoid confusion, he explained that ERISA, (the tax treatment of contributions on benefits of employee plans) are irrelevant to these coverages. He then went into greater detail describing both Defined Contribution Plans as well as Defined Benefit Plans.

Once the various plans were fully discussed, he turned his attention the Qualified Participant. He discussed the regulatory requirements for employees to be excluded from mandatory coverage, and described the tests/conditions that may be used to determine participation in either plans. He then discussed an in depth look into qualifications for Part-Time Employees, Seasonal Employees, Temporary Employees, the Alternative Lookback Rule, Former Participants, and the DREADED....REHIRED ANNUITANT!

The presentation then turned to Deferred Retirement Option Plans which Michael, defined and described in detail. Michael finished his presentation by discussing Section 414(h)(2) Pickup Arrangements and Hybrid Defined Benefit Plans. A question/answer session was held to ensure understanding.

Michael's presentation was complete, well organized and gave NCSSSA members a great deal of useful information that we can use to help guide our "customers" in regards to FICA Replacement Plans.

Kirk Larson started off with a brief history of Social Security including the effective dates of Retirement insurance, Survivors insurance, Disability insurance, Medicare, SSI, and Medicare Part D.

#### Session Title: State Outreach Panel Speaker: W. Grant Wright, New Mexico; Dean Conder, Colorado; Danielle Huffine, Iowa; Meghann Spring, Montana. Moderator: Meghann Spring, Montana

A panel presentation was constructed and geared towards new SSSA's and being a resource for those wanting more information on personalized out-reach within our states.

Grant opened the presentation with discussion on the various agencies and departments that we all work with, across the nation. We all have a special uniqueness and duties as assigned. Grant works in the NM Retirement system, 100,000 employees and 300 public employers. [Dean is with Co. Labor & Employment, Danielle is with Public Employees' Retirement System and Meghann is under Department of Administration.]

Grant has guides available for entities (on-line) and paper-versions for when he can't travel. Please note: New Mexico is a divided and majority vote state.

Danielle spoke about Iowa being an Absolute Coverage State, some of their out-reach with Kansas City SSA to create a new police officer modification as well as outreach to the entities that were to vote in referendum.

Dean followed with discussion on finding entities within your state. They work with the Department of Local Affairs to track and discover when filings are created to create a new entity. DoLA contacts Dean/Maryann.

Due to a reduction in budget, they no longer travel as much. They would invite other folks to do presentations (Ex: ICE), so that others would be interested in discussions. He suggested tapping local associations, such as League of Cities, Association of Counties, etc.

(Rita discussed the 8821 form from the IRS, for discussion with an entity. (She has them sign it immediately.)

Meghann discussed internet usage and the recent update for the State Financial Services Division website (SSSA included.) Meghann plans on at least updating the Fact Corner at least quarterly or sooner if needed. This is a work in progress and there is hope for a counter on the page, to count "hits." We also suggested other websites to go visit, compare and utilize for each states outreach and education.

This presentation was met with many questions and a spirited audience involvement. The take-away from Mr. Fox' session was the boiling down of several key points including ineligibles and optionals are people....not positions. Ineligible and optional status is based on timing (what is the employee's status on the relevant date?)

Key definitions noted include:

*Ineligible* – "an employee who, on first occupying a position under a retirement system, is not eligible for membership in that system because of a *personal disqualification* like age, physical condition, or length of service" 20 C.F.R. Section 404.1208(a)

*Optional* – "employee in a position covered by a retirement system who had the option to join the system on the date he or she first occupied the position" Handbook Section 30001.334.B

This session brought simplicity and clarity to a potentially baffling topic.

#### Session Title: Legal Framework Update, including New Information About Charter Schools Speakers: Ms. Susan Bussman, SSA/HQ; Mr. Anthony J. Roda, Esq., Williams & Jensen, PLLC.; Mr. Benjamin Prevas, Esq., SSA/HQ/OGC Moderator: Maryann Motza, PhD

Ms. Susan Bussman, Staff Director, Retirement and Survivors Insurance Branch Office of Legislation and Congressional Affairs, U.S. Social Security Administration, addressed current or anticipated legislative proposals related to the major things that always concern NCSSSA's members. See the attached PowerPoint slides (see Appendix A) where she addressed the following:

- 1) Windfall Elimination Provision "WEP" (including, H.R. 711, 114th Congress, cosponsored by Representatives Brady and Neal).
- 2) H.R. 973, introduced on February 13, 2015, by Congressman Rodney David and an identical bill (S. 1651) which was introduced on June 23, 2015, by Senator Sherrod Brown, both of which would repeal both WEP and the Government Pension Offset "GPO."
- 3) Issues related to the imminent exhaustion of the Disability Insurance (DI) Trust Fund; reserves are scheduled to be depleted in December 2016.
- 4) Proposals included in the President's budget that may impact state and local governments.
- 5) No bills have been introduced in the 114<sup>th</sup> Congress that would impose universal (mandatory) Social Security (OASDI portion) on all non-covered state and local government employees (either for new hires only and/or for all active employees).

Copies of the PowerPoint slides from Ms. Bussman's presentation are attached to this report.

Mr. Roda, Partner, Williams & Jensen, PLLC., addressed the following:

- 1) H.R. 2618, 113th Congress, to allow Medicare-only opt in by state and local government employees.
- 2) Summarized Public Law 114-14 and Public Law 114-26 that affected Federal tax treatment of survivor and retirement benefits of public safety officers.
- 3) The Annuity Accumulation Plan for public employees which was proposed by Senator Orrin Hatch (S. 1270, 113<sup>th</sup> Congress).
- Employer pick-up issues associated with Internal Revenue Code Section 414(h)(2) (H.R. 205; 113<sup>th</sup> Congress).

Copies of the PowerPoint slides for Mr. Roda's portion of the legislative and regulatory update are attached to this report as Appendix B.

Mr. Roda also reviewed and discussed recent documents that provide some guidance about charter schools from the IRS's and Tax Exempt/Government Entities' Counsel's perspectives. Mr. Roda summarized and analyzed information issued by TE/GE Counsel both for the Employee Plans and Federal State Local Governments sections that address how each treat political subdivisions of the states vis-à-vis their particular sections of federal law. Mr. Roda discussed the recent Notice 2015-07 that addressed proposed new regulations related to IRC Section 414(d). Another document that was discussed and analyzed by Mr. Roda is the redacted version of the Memorandum, dated January 23, 2015, issued by TE/GE Counsel wherein that office provided advice to a "Wholly-Owned Instrumentality Status of X Charter School" vis-à-vis determining the FICA tax liability under Internal Revenue Code section 3121(b)(7)(F). Mr. Roda explained that the redacted Memorandum cannot be used as definitive and controlling, but the analysis and tests TE/GE Counsel applied can be instructive for all State Social Security Administrators and their state and local government customers. This portion of the session involved comparing and contrasting the similarities and differences in how TE/GE Counsel view these issues. It gives State Administrators guidance in what issues to look for in their states related to treatment of political subdivisions, especially charter schools, which vary significantly from state to state. Copies of the materials Mr. Roda discussed related to charter schools as well as the PowerPoint slides that accompanied his presentation are attached to this report as Appendix B.

Mr. Benjamin Prevas, Esq., Attorney, Office of Program Law, Office of the General Counsel, U.S. Social Security Administration, compared and contrasted the University of Texas and the University of Minnesota (Mayo) cases. This was timely because the U.S. Supreme Court recently declined to review the Fifth Circuit's affirming of the District Court's decision in the University of Texas System case which discussed the student exclusion provision of Section 218 of the U.S. Social Security Act as it applies to medical residents. Copies of both court decisions are attached to this report as Appendix C.

Session Title: Differences Between Majority and Divided Vote Referendum Processes and Outcomes

**Overview and Scope of Topic**: This session will explore the legal and practical differences between the majority and divided vote referendum processes. Social Security Administration (SSA) officials will discuss any issues or concerns the Office of General Counsel and Regional Offices have observed related to referendum election information received from the states. This session will include SSA's recommendations for how State Administrators should address those issues, such as suggesting state legislative changes (when and how to identify the necessity of such changes), modifications that might be needed to the State's Master Section 218 Agreement (when and how to identify the necessity of such changes), process improvements, records retention issues and concerns, and so forth.

Both speakers have been invited to address the topic according to the scope and manner in which he/she feels is best so that both the Social Security Administration's and each state's needs are appropriately discussed and considered.

### Natalie K. Jemison

Assistant Regional Counsel Social Security Administration Office of the Regional Chief Counsel Atlanta

Natalie began working with the Office of the General Counsel, Social Security Administration, Atlanta in March 2001, Natalie's practice areas include: State and Local Coverage, General Law, and Representative Sanctions. ### Session Title: Modification Process from Beginning to End Speaker: Mr. Kirk Jockell, SSA/Atlanta Moderator: Mr. Madison Davis, Arkansas

The focus of this training session was solely on the process of completing a modification from beginning to end. A modification amends a Section 218 Agreement to extend Social Security and Medicare coverage to new groups of employees, identifies new political subdivisions joining a public retirement system, corrects errors in previous modifications, implements changes in Federal or State law.

Mr. Jockell's presentation explained the necessary steps at the U.S. Social Security Administration's Regional Offices when processing a Section 218 Modification from receipt in the mail from a State Social Security Administrator (SSSA) through approval by the Office of General Counsel (OGC) through final approval by the Regional Commissioner to notify the SSSA of the final outcome (or any intermediate communication with the SSSA regarding concerns and issues that are identified along the way).

When preparing a modification:

- clearly state its purpose
- use the sample language in the exhibits
- request assistance from the RO if special language is required
- list all optional exclusions
- include all statewide optional exclusions, from the original agreement, in each modification.

After preparing the modification:

- If the modification is complex or there is a question concerning the legality of any provision request a preliminary review from the Regional Office (RO) through the Parallel Social Security Office (PSSO).
- Submit two original modifications with the pen-and-ink signature(s) of the authorized State official(s) to the PSSO. Provide extra copies if you want more than one signed copy.
- The RO reviews the modification and approves (or denies) coverage SSA decisions are final. A modification must meet the requirements of Federal and State laws.
- The RO specialist requests an OGC legal review of the modification. The RO specialist should follow-up with OGC in 30 days if a response has not been received.
- Upon OGC approval, the RO specialist prepares a notification of approval letter and hand delivers the entire modification packet to the Regional Commissioner, or designated official.
- The Regional Commissioner or designated official must sign the approval letter and all original copies of the modification.

The speaker knowledge and familiarity of the modification process was well-received by conference attendees.




**Overview and Scope of Topic**: This session will explain the steps at the U.S. Social Security Administration's Regional Offices when processing a Section 218 Modification from receipt in the mail from a State Social Security Administrator (SSSA) through approval by the Office of General Counsel (OGC) through final approval by the Regional Commissioner to notifying the SSSA of the final outcome (or any intermediate communication with the SSSA regarding concerns and issues that are identified along the way). For example, verifying FICA deductions under the stated EIN, confirming authority under state law to conduct a divided or majority vote referendum for the coverage group included in a referendum, etc.



## Session Title: Extending Social Security Coverage to Police and Firefighter Positions under a Retirement System

Speakers: John Fox, Esp., SSA/OGC/Kansas City and Fred Sanchez, Esq., SSA/OGC/Chicago

### Moderator: Danielle Huffine, Iowa

Mr. Fox and Mr. Sanchez discussed how the states need to proceed to extend SS coverage to the police and firefighters already under a retirement system. Most states need to change legislation and/or complete a modification that allows the state to add the police and firefighters to the State's Section 218 Agreement. A law change in 1994 allowed police and firefighters to be covered; however, most section 218 agreements were never changed. Some states even completed referendums in error. There was also a great deal of discussion on what constitutes a police/firefighter position. This may be established in your statute.

There is a new format (templates) that SSA wants administrators to use and if the original agreement has roman numerals, letters and numbers, you must retain that system in the new modification.

John and Fred went through the processes that the States of Idaho, Iowa, and Michigan had to follow to extend coverage to their police and firefighters.

NCSSSA representatives on the ACT Committee and Section 218 Council and provided an overview of the intended roles of each group as well as updates on issues discussed, concerns raised and efforts pursued within each committee to further the cooperative relationship between NCSSSA and our federal partners. Overall, these multiparty groups have made progress in improving interaction and communication between the NCSSSA, Internal Revenue Service and Social Security Administration. We anticipate continued continued positive results based on commitment by all three partners to use these groups as forums for sharing/exchanging information.

Mr. Roda, unfortunately, could not attend the conference, but agreed to call in to provide his insights on new developments, in general, and to discuss legislative changes that might impact our members.

### AD Hoc Committee / Name change

Because this topic was brought up in several meetings and conversations, there was a consensus that the idea should be addressed and a recommendation brought to the Executive Committee for consideration. The Ad Hoc Committee was formed by the President with the directive to survey members on their thoughts of a name change while maintaining the NCSSSA branding; research the history of the reason for the current name and see if that still applies; research the implications of a change and any items that would need changed (Constitution, website, 501c6 status, etc); and then recommend one name, if any, to the Executive Committee. The Ad Hoc Committee also had the authority to recommend to the Executive Committee, that no change be made.

## The following questions were asked to individuals that represent NCSSSA in outside meetings and conduct daily business for the NCSSSA:

- 1. What would be the impact regarding our bank accounts? Be specific. Please list what financial accounts we have and what the process would be to change a name of an account (forms, online process, cost time).
- 2. What supply inventory do we currently have that has our name either spelled out and/or has our acronym? Please list all items, quantities and if possible, cost.
- 3. Please list any contracts, associations, foundations, etc., we deal with on a regular basis that this change may have an impact on and how we conduct business with our partners. Would this change have a negative impact on our associates (updating their website, brochures, contact information)?

### **Results:**

- 1.
- Didn't see this as a big issue and most can be accomplished by simple transfer documents.
- New paperwork will have to be completed, including new signature cards.
- Our checks are currently low, so the cost will be approximately \$25.00 to reorder.
- A new 990-EZ form would have to be filed with the IRS.

### 2.

• Supply inventory does not seem to be an issue. Any letterhead, forms, envelopes or other supplies are done electronically and can be updated easily with our current software. There would be no cost.

### 3.

- If we're changing one word in the overall name, website changes would be minimal.
- If the full name were to be changed or the acronym, there would be a great deal more work involved and time.
- The logo is not a problem as a simple program was used and it would take very little time to create a new logo.
- Changing one word on websites, publications and forms might be an added burden to our federal partners.
- Some entities that might be impacted by this change are: IRS, SSA, GFOA and various other pension networks.
- Didn't see a problem with vendors, contractors and hotels, existing or pending contracts should not be an issue.
- We need to investigate whether our non-profit standing be jeopardized with IRS.

### **Results/comments of survey sent to NCSSSA membership:**

- We have a total of 30 responses.
- 53% suggested a name change would be appropriate.
- Approximately 37% did not want a name change.
- Proposal is to change "one word" in our name.
- We would need to contact Angie to determine how much print material we actually have to assess loss if we make a change.
- Most of what we do is online, so overall cost may be minimal.
- Not everyone likes change, but change may suggest we're "keeping up with the times."
- Pro name change offered the following:
  - Change "Conference" to Association, Consortium, Committee, Council.
  - The definitions provided suggests a change would better define who we are and what we do.

- Any changes to material would be a one-time change.
- Most material is online, so the fix would be easy.
- Because we are changing one word in the name, the change would not be disruptive.
- Conference = meeting whereas Council represents a group discussion and decision makers.
- o Instead of changing our name, change the annual conference name.
- Con
  - o Issue is mundane and it's taking away from more important issues.
  - Concerned about the time it will take to change all our material, accounts, etc.
  - o If it's not broken, why change it.
  - Not sure the purpose or point of changing our name.
  - Any outside affiliations will be confused by a name change.
  - Some said no, but gave no reason.
  - Staying the same suggests stability.

### Summary:

As someone pointed out, there is never a good time for change. Based on the results of our survey and receiving feedback from various individuals throughout our organization, the overall opinion seems to be strong in both directions. If a change were suggested, the change does not have to be accomplished this year and the process could be scheduled out over a period of time so individuals can deal with any unforeseen issues.

If the organization is researching and contemplating a change, a suggestion was made to consider a more aggressive approach and come up with other options or possibly a full name change.

Overall, the topic should be discussed further and if possible, addressed at our next Annual Conference for additional feedback. To end this, I'll summarize what our President stated, "a name change is a very small step and does not speak to the larger issue, which is transforming how our constituents see us."

#### **Recommendation by Ad Hoc Committee:**

At this time, do not move forward with a name change until all members of the NCSSSA have a chance to hear and discuss the proposal for the name change.

The Governing Documents Committee was created and introduced by an action of the Executive Committee in September 2014. The former Constitution & By-Laws and Policy & Procedures Committees consolidated to form this new Committee. The purpose for the consolidation is to provide NCSSSA with a comprehensive, consistent, and coordinated management process for developing and maintaining the governing documents which include the Constitution & By-Laws, Policy, Mission/Vision/Values Statement, and Standard Operating Procedures.

During the Conference Year, the Committee activities included:

- Six conference call meetings
- Multiple electronic meetings to review and edit governing documents, vote to accept edits and submitting the Committee's recommendations to the Executive Committee.
- Called upon all members for Constitution & By-Laws comments and amendments (through a request from each Regional Vice President to his/her Administrators).
- Called upon each Officer and Committee Chair to review and edit Standard Operating Procedures.
- Created Standard Operating Procedures for
  - o Governing Documents Committee
  - Executive Committee
- Reviewed, edited, accepted, and submitted recommendations to the Executive Committee for the following governing documents:
  - Constitution & By-Laws
  - o Policy
    - Tribute & Announcement
    - Standardized the travel reimbursement form
    - Revised the Travel Reimbursement Policy

- o President
- o Secretary
- o **Treasurer**
- o Resolution
- Training & Succession Planning
- Election (formerly Nominating)
- All remaining Standard Operating Procedures were reviewed by the Governing Documents Committee for uniformity, however, not revised at the Position or Committee Chairs' recommendations. The following Committees were edited for uniformity in names and to add the Executive Committee approved language stating: "The Chair may be designated as a full member of the Governing Documents Committee at the Discretion of the President.":
  - Auditing Committee
  - Internet Communications Committee
  - Legislative Committee
  - o Membership Committee
  - Networking Sessions Committee
  - Program Committee
  - Time & Place Committee
- Notable changes and achievements include:
  - The President will have full online access to all bank accounts and shall review the activity no less than monthly.
  - Defined prerequisites for the elected officer positions.
  - Standard Operating Procedure revisions will become effective on the first day of the following conference year unless otherwise stated in the Standard Operating Procedures.
  - All governing documents will include a revision date.
  - Committee chairs may be designated as a full member of the Governing Documents Committee at the discretion of the President.
  - Constitution & By-Laws and officer voting will be completed electronically beginning after the July 2015 Annual Conference.
  - Constitution & By-Laws voting has been better defined to include all Designated Members.
  - Coordinated with the Internet and Communications Committee, the Standard Operating Procedures banner page on the website has been redesigned.
  - Attendance certificates for Annual Conference attendees will be prepared and distributed by the Resolution Committee, as requested.
  - Executive Committee roles, responsibilities, and processes have been documented, including naming a quorum to be present as a requirement for passing any issue.
- In the final days of the Standard Operating Reviews prior to Annual Conference, comments from members have created the following observations and recommendations for the incoming Governing Documents Committee:

- Address the responsibilities of the 218 Council members either in an existing or creating a specific Standard Operating Procedure allowing for input from members prior to quarterly meetings and a summary of quarterly meetings using any or all of the available resources (Executive Committee, Regional Vice Presidents, Forum, GoogleGroups, SurveyMonkey).
- Time & Place Committee
  - Address the contract language regarding CONUS rate changes from the effective date of the contract to the opening date for attendee registration.
  - Consider a tiered cancellation liquidation schedule.
- Define the voting process for each Committee excluding the Executive Committee
  - Is a majority of members present required to conduct business including/excluding voting?
  - Is a majority vote of the full committee's membership or a majority vote of committee members in attendance required to pass a vote?
- Define the minimum number of members for all Committees. For example, all Committees must have a minimum of three members including the Chair.

To Angie, Madison, Michele, Rick, Shirley, and T.J. – my thanks and appreciation for your hard work and contributions as a member of this Committee. I know how much time this Committee has demanded. Your ideas, understanding, support, thoughtful disagreements, and patience have made this a successful year. The purpose of the NCSSSA Program Committee is to: plan, organize, direct, and manage the Annual Conference.

The Program Committee began by having an organizational conference call on September 9, 2014. A regular, monthly conference call schedule was established. At the beginning of the September call the existing Program Committee's section of the NCSSSA Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) Manual was reviewed and discussed so everyone had a clear understanding of the Committee's responsibilities. Also during that first conference call it was decided that the most efficient way to approach Committee responsibilities was to divide the workload and assignments among all Committee members by forming subcommittees that would conducted conference calls and/or exchange emails to accomplish assigned tasks between the full Program Committee conference calls. An agenda was distributed prior to each meeting and summary notes, including action items, were provided after each conference call. Between conference calls numerous email exchanges occurred to ensure issues were addressed as quickly as possible, if action was needed before the next regularly schedule conference call. During the course of the program year, the Committee acted both as the "Committee of the Whole" and also established several subcommittees to facilitate completion of all tasks, as follows:<sup>1</sup>

### Committee of the Whole:

- Reviewed, amended as deemed necessary and appropriate, and approved subcommittee recommendations.
- The Program Committee reviewed and discussed the NCSSSA Name Change Ad Hoc Committee's request for feedback. The Executive Committee voted to postpone any action on the Name Change until it can be discussed by the full NCSSSA membership at the Annual Conference in Seattle in July 2015. The Program Committee added this topic to the Annual Conference agenda.
- Reviewed and discussed recommended changes to the Program Committee Standard Operating Procedures (SOP). Committee members identified some changes that the majority of the committee recommended be considered by the Governing Documents and Executive Committees. No changes to the current SOP are recommended until after they are discussed during the 2015 Annual Conference because the majority of the changes relate to proposing that the name of the "Annual Conference" be changed to "Annual Convention" to avoid confusion with the organization's name. Those recommendations will be discussed when the Name Change Ad Hoc Committee provides its report and the NCSSSA membership discusses how to proceed further with a possible name change for the organization.
- Served as a "beta-test" for the NCSSSA Forum. NCSSSA FORUM LINK: <u>http://www.ncsssa.org/index.php</u>. The Program Committee found the Forum to be a valuable tool not only for the current program year, but also as a way to preserve ideas for future annual conferences as well as an excellent way to store documents that can be adapted by other Program Committees as they plan future conferences.
- Received information from Susie Dahl, NAPPA Executive Director, on how NAPPA manages and operates.
- Various organizational documents were used by the Committee during the course of the conference year to ensure all necessary and appropriate actions were taken in a timely manner. The Seattle Annual Conference Planning Sheet became the principal tool to plan, monitor, and confirm arrangements.

- Drafted and evaluated a survey to solicit suggestions for the 2015 Program. Committee members took a prospective look, i.e., "if NCSSSA was just established how would we want to set up our Annual Conference? What do we want to accomplish?" As part of that process, three of NCSSSA's committees (Program, Networking Sessions, and Training & Succession Planning) developed a joint survey that was distributed in August 2014 to those who attended the New Orleans Annual Conference. The final results of that survey are available at: <a href="https://www.surveymonkey.com/results/SM-5G8D9LCJ/">https://www.surveymonkey.com/results/SM-5G8D9LCJ/</a>. Information obtained from that survey was instrumental to development of the proposed program (see the Program Content Subcommittee summary, below, for further information).
- In addition, to ensure any last-minute revisions and adjustments to the program were coordinated among all presenters, Maryann Motza, as the Program Committee Chair handled all final arrangements with the speakers and moderators. Adjustments to the program were necessary for various reasons. The final "block schedule" for the Seattle Annual Conference and other materials that were distributed to speakers and moderators are included in the archive folders on the NCSSSA Forum.
- Conference evaluation survey for the Seattle conference. Lead: Maryann Motza. The survey that was created and approved for use by the full Program Committee is available at: https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/D2FZBDK and the results of that survey are available at: https://www.surveymonkey.com/results/SM-F3Y9Z8CJ/.

### Subcommittees:

#### **Program Content Subcommittee**

The Program Content Subcommittee recommended the following topics (numbered for ease of reference, not to indicate relative importance):

- 1. Public Pension Plan theme including what can be a pension plan and how is it taxed. It would include Hybrid Plans and Drop Plans-Rob Choi, an IRS field person, was suggested as a presenter. This can be combined with the topic discussed in number 2.
- 2. Overview of public pension and common terms and concepts. This can be combined with the topic discussed in number 1.
- 3. Social Media-Given by SSA and IRS discussing their use of videos/internet/teleconferencing/online SSA calculator. This would be about Federal outreach and referral information for the SSSAs.

- 4. State Outreach-Formalized Outreach by State Social Security Administrators using YouTube/traveling, tutorials on 218 and other presentations, etc. to educate before a local entity has a problem. A survey of State Administrators was conducted by the Program Committee to facilitate the panel's preparation for its presentation. The final results of that survey are at: https://www.surveymonkey.com/results/SM-F6XXPCDY/.
- 5. IRS Risk Areas identified through the 218 assessment project. This goes well with the State Outreach presentation to prevent problems before they occur.
- 6. Social Security Databases/Security of Electronic Information/Retention of Documents. How are documents provided to SSA and the IRS? How do you get copies of documents from the regional SSA office and the IRS? Thumb drives/jump drives are not secure. What are issues that you have with your IS/IT department in the transfer of information? Does your email have a limit on the size of a document attachment? What is kept in fire proof cabinets? What are destruction policies and practices? This could be done with someone from Baltimore, such as Marc Denos, in conjunction with a State Social Security Administrator to discuss the federal government's policy on document retention and how to implement it at the state level. Mary Griffin could coordinate with Marc Denos. This fits in well with the topic listed in number 7 below.
- 7. Old Age Survivor Insurance (OASI) filing systems (goes with the topic in 6) How do SSSA's keep their files? In paper/electronic? What type of database? Is it searchable/indexed? Are the documents easily retrieved? Does your state OASI law allow electronic filing? How do you get the documents scanned? What are the costs/equipment associated with a project like this? Was the scanning done as part of a Departmental scanning contract? How is the database maintained? We propose doing a survey of administrators to see how OASI documents are currently filed and whether they have a law in place, etc. to tailor the presentation to the audience. Meghann Butler-Spring offered to help formulate questions for a Survey Monkey questionnaire. This topic had a lot of interest and it was suggested that we take an idea from another organization and have tables set aside at lunch marked for discussion of this topic. This can be an effective way to network and exchange information. Mary Griffin offered to present the Tennessee electronic filing project and would work with Marc Denos and others on this topic as well. NOTE: A survey of records maintenance and retention practices was drafted by Program Committee members, but it was never distributed because this topic was dropped from the Seattle program. This topic will be reserved for consideration by future Program Committees.
- 8. Wage Reporting 101-what must employers file and how? Address Error Modifications, retroactive pay, and Rehired Annuitants when an entity paid and should not have as well as when they did not pay and should have done so. Many State Social Security Administrators need to understand how this

process works, even though State Administrators no longer process the documents. This would be a joint IRS/SSA presentation.

- 9. Police Officers/Firefighters/employees/EMTs. Some of these people were hired prior to 1986 as are other employees in state and local governments and this topic would address the options for employees who have not paid into Medicare. Could they draw on a spouse? Prior employment? Apply for insurance through the Exchanges? State Administrators need referral options for these employees. NOTE: Police Officers were added to the original topic suggested by the Subcommittee, based on a discussion of the survey results by the full Committee.
- 10. Wrap up: Hot Topics in Legislation. The subcommittee members indicated they thought it is important to have a legislative update every year and would like Maryann Motza, as Chair of the Legislative Committee, to be the moderator and to invite Susan Bussman from the Social Security Administration headquarters to speak. Time needs to be built in for discussion about concerns.
- 11. Because Mark Brown will be retiring soon, the subcommittee members wanted to ensure he would speak in Seattle. Subcommittee members would like to offer him an hour and a half to present on the topic of his choice and puppets MUST be included!
- 12. Kirk Jockell is also retiring soon. It was proposed that he could talk about the steps at the Regional Social Security Office in processing a Section 218 Modification from receipt in the mail from a State Administrator through the Office of General Counsel to final approval by the Regional Commissioner. Among the items to be addressed, for example, would be verifying FICA deductions under the stated EIN, etc.
- 13. Consolidations, annexations, dissolutions, particularly regarding school districts/local governments.
- 14. K through 12 school districts; this would go along with number 13. Some school consolidations, become "K-12 Schools," others are allowed to change their name. Montana has experienced these issues.

Additionally, the Subcommittee discussed some of the comments from the surveys:

- It is good to have some review of information and some new presentations with Monday and Tuesday being the true training days and Sunday and Wednesday being business sessions.
- It is important to have a variety of speakers from a variety of agencies.
- Perhaps have some designated tables for "discussion" during our lunch caucuses.

- Have at least one panel.
- Have time to discuss concerns coming up. This can be paired with the Legislative Hot Topics session.
- Encourage handouts for all presentations.
- Consider the amount of time needed to fully cover a topic. Also time for discussion.
- Keep the speakers running on time.
- Consider starting with more basic topics and working towards more difficult ones.
- Continue to cover the role of the State Administrators for new attendees and others that want to attend in the Sunday afternoon session and use the session to energize administrators about why their role is important and how to communicate the importance of the role to management/the powers that be.
- <u>Registration Fee/Meals, breaks, menus/Registration Gifts</u>. Beth Dillon (Subcommittee Chair) with Angie Dowdy, Danielle Huffine, Melanie Piccin, Kim Smith, and Grant Wright. **NOTE:** This subcommittee worked closely with the Social Events Subcommittee as well as with the Networking Sessions Committee. Recommendations of this subcommittee which were approved by the full Program Committee are included as part of the archived materials on the NCSSSA Forum.
- <u>Social Events</u>. Angie Dowdy (Subcommittee Chair) with Beth Dillon, Melanie Piccin, and Kim Smith. **NOTE:** This subcommittee worked closely with the Registration Fee/Meals, breaks, menus/Registration Gifts Subcommittee as well as with the Networking Sessions Committee. The Networking Committee decided not to host a Monday Night Event in Seattle.
- <u>Theme and Logo</u>. Kim Smith (Subcommittee Chair) with Melanie Piccin, and Meghann Butler. The final theme and logo that were adopted for the Seattle Annual Conference are on the NCSSSA Forum in the archive folder.
- <u>Preparation of the draft conference call and "Save the Date" announcements</u>. Meghann Butler-Spring (Subcommittee Chair), Danielle Huffine, and Maryann Motza. See the archives of the NCSSSA Forum for the final conference call and save the date announcements.
- Program Booklet. Angie Dowdy (Subcommittee Chair) with Maryann Motza.
- *Audio-visual needs* (based on contract terms). Angle Dowdy (Subcommittee Chair) with Beth Dillon.
- <u>Points to discuss during Regional Conference Break-out Sessions</u>. James Sawyer (Subcommittee Chair) with Mary Griffin. The agenda for the break-out sessions on Sunday, July 26<sup>th</sup> is included in the archives on the NCSSSA Forum.

- Moderator Coordination. Mary Griffin (Subcommittee Chair) with James Sawyer.
- <u>Monitor hotel and conference registrations</u>, compare/contrast the two lists, and follow-up with appropriate Regional Vice President to have them encourage additional participation from their regions as well as to remind anyone who has registered for either the hotel or conference, but not both, to complete the appropriate registration that is missing. Beth Dillon (Subcommittee Chair) with James Sawyer.
- **Finance Subcommittee** (to compare & contrast proposed expenses against past conferences). Danielle Huffine (Subcommittee Chair) with Kim Smith.
- <u>Plan a "special" event or tribute for Mark Brown</u>. Melanie Piccin (Subcommittee Chair) with Meghann Butler-Spring and TJ Reardon.

### **Topics Identified for Future Programs**

The following topics were not used for the Seattle program, but are recommended for consideration as part of future programs:

- Old Age Survivor Insurance (OASI) filing systems. How do State Administrators keep their files?
- Social Security Databases/Security of Electronic Information/Retention of Documents.
- Social Media from the Social Security Administration's perspective. (This topic will be addressed during the Seattle conference from the IRS's perspective.)

- 3. Social Media-Given by SSA and IRS discussing their use of videos/internet/teleconferencing/online SSA calculator. This would be about Federal outreach and referral information for the SSSAs.
- 6. Social Security Databases/Security of Electronic Information/Retention of Documents. How are documents provided to SSA and the IRS? How do you get copies of documents from the regional SSA office and the IRS? Thumb drives/jump drives are not secure. What are issues that you have with your IS/IT department in the transfer of information? Does your email have a limit on the size of a document attachment? What is kept in fire proof cabinets? What are destruction policies and practices?

Was the scanning done as part of a Departmental scanning contract? How is the database maintained? We propose doing a survey of administrators to see how OASI documents are currently filed and whether they have a law in place, etc. to tailor the presentation to the audience. This topic had a lot of interest and it was suggested that we take an idea from another organization and have tables set aside at lunch marked for discussion of this topic. This can be an effective way to network and exchange information. Mary G. has offered to present the Tennessee electronic filing project and would work with Marc Denos/others on number 6 as well.

The purpose of the NCSSSA Time and Place (T & P) Committee is to: solicit bids, negotiate contract specifications, and recommend future host sites for the Annual Conference to the Executive Committee.

During the course of the 2014-2015 conference year, T & P Committee did just that. We initially had four states offer sites. Colorado removed their name, once they knew we had other states offering. Arkansas, West Virginia and Texas all sent information for conference location sites.

T & P Committee had organizational conference calls, beginning October 16, 2014. Conference calls/discussions were held as needed, as well as email editing and question/answers as needed.

Madison Davis removed Arkansas from the contention, thus Texas and West Virginia were analyzed on the January 15, 2015 conference call. Mr. James Sawyer (Texas SSSA) and Mr. Mark Shelhammer (West Virginia SSSA) were invited to sit in on the beginning of the call and discuss options each state offered. T & P Committee followed SOP rules (#5 and 6 specifically during this time). After much deliberation T & P proposed to Executive Committee to line up two states for conferences into 2018. Both offered great locations and atmosphere for the NCSSSA Conference. With permission granted, we have selected Charleston, WV, for the 2017 conference and moving to the southern part of the USA in 2018: Texas. Both Executive Committee and Time and Place felt comfortable with lining up these states, however, leaving to the discretion of the next T & P Committee to choose which city and negotiate the RFP, etc.

T & P Committee worked with Ms. Nancy Pennington from the West Virginia State Auditor's office. [We are very grateful and thankful for the help she provided in soliciting and gathering RFP's in Charleston.] We analyzed 4 sites, narrowing down to two locations. Upon further discussion and based on recommendations, Marriott Charleston was selected for our 2017 NCSSSA Conference location.

T & P Committee also requested to serve as a "beta-tester" for the NCSSSA Forum. As a whole, our committee felt this was a great way to upload history and pass along information to the next committee. (The past few years, we have had several states show interest in hosting the NCSSSA Conference.)

I wish to thank each person on Time & Place Committee, for their dedication and contribution towards the entire process, from deciding where to host to the finalization of the RFP.

### **Internet Communications Committee**

The Conference Presentation page on the NCSSSA website was redesigned to provide a menu of the presentations. The updated format uses a drop down menu system. The drop down menu is categorized by year and includes the presentation name and the presenter name.

Several file sharing options were researched for sharing secure or sensitive information with the NCSSSA membership. The options that were researched and tested were a secure webpage, secure PDF files and a member's only Forum.

The secure webpage would require a password before opening the page. It included coding that would direct to the page if the correct password was entered. If the incorrect password was entered, the page contents would be encrypted. The chief complaints with this page were that the password had to be entered each time you were directed back to the page and there would just be one universal password for all users.

The secure PDF files would require a password to open the file. Access to the page would be granted to all users, but the PDF files could not be opened without the password. This resolved the issue with reentering the password when directed back to the page, but it would still use one universal password for the files.

The Forum is an internet-based system that has been designed as a tool to share secure information with members. It can also be a useful communication tool for Committee Chairs as a discussion board during a current Conference Year, as well as a

file sharing system between current and future Committee members. The forum allows users to create their own User ID and password which helps to maintain the security by not sharing a password.

After testing within the Committee, the Internet Committee presented all three options to the Executive Committee for review. It was decided to move forward with further testing of the Forum as this option not only serves the purpose of sharing secure documents with the membership, but it also addressed the concerns raised by the other options. A beta test was conducted with several members and committees using the forum for several months and then completing a survey for the usefulness of the site. The results were shared with the Executive Committee and they voted to move forward with using the NCSSSA Forum as the secure file sharing method. A registration notification was sent through the Google Group to notify members of the Forum and how to sign up.

The format in which the Standard Operating Procedures were presented on the website has been updated. Formerly, the SOP was a PDF file that included all SOPs in one document that was posted on the Forms and Publications page. This format has been replaced with a webpage that is dedicated to the SOPs with links to each individual SOP. A button was added to the side bar menu to access this page. A link to the page is also on the Forms and Publications page. All SOPs have been updated and are available for review on the website.

Roster changes for State Administrators and Social Security Regional contacts are current as of July 2015. All 2015 Conference Presentations will be added and Committee assignments will be updated as soon as they are made available.

### **Legislative Committee**

The purpose of the NCSSSA Legislative Committee is to: monitor, maintain, assess, and disseminate proposed legislative, policy, and regulatory changes affecting Social Security and employment tax programs at the federal and state levels of government. Provide analyses and proposed responses to NCSSSA leadership and other appropriate officials.

The 2014-2015 Legislative Committee conducted an organizational conference call on September 10, 2014. The Committee was extremely active again this year, having accomplished the following:

- Held multiple conference calls during the program year. During the first conference call it was again decided that the most efficient way to approach Committee responsibilities was to divide the workload and assignments among all Committee members. An agenda was distributed prior to each meeting and summary notes, including action items, were provided after each conference call. Between conference calls numerous email exchanges occurred to ensure issues were addressed as quickly as possible.
- 2. Continued networking/liaison relationship with twenty (20) organizations or policymaking bodies at the national level and added eight (8) new ones that have similar issues and concerns to NCSSSA (numbered for ease of reference, not to indicate relative importance.), i.e.:

Between conference calls, informational emails and reports from the above organizations were shared with members of the Legislative Committee and the NCSSSA leadership to ensure they were apprised of significant national-level issues and developments.

- 3. Follow-up assignments from 2013-2014. The Legislative Committee had a number of follow-up assignments that carried over into 2014-2015. Those items were:
  - A. A letter was drafted to the Council of State Governments recommending that they work with NCSSSA in the future, especially when issues associated with state and local governments" FICA taxes, public pension system requirements, and Social Security/Medicare coverage and benefit topics arise. See Appendix A for the final letter.

B. Center for Retirement Research (CRR) at Boston College published a study on integration of Social Security into the public sector. The study was "commissioned" by the U.S. Social Security Administration through a grant to CRR. The report, entitled "The Impact of Mandatory Coverage on State and Local Budgets" was issued in May 2014 and is available at: http://crr.bc.edu/working-papers/the-impact-of-mandatory-coverage-on-stateand-local-budgets/. During 2013-2014, Ms. DeVore gave Dr. Motza a "heads up" that such a report was being prepared by CRR and a footnote in the final report acknowledged NCSSSA's historical opposition to universal (or "mandatory") Social Security coverage for state and local governmental employees. That occurred because Dr. Motza contacted Mr. Jean-Pierre (JP) Aubry, Deputy Director of the Center for Retirement Research at Boston College (CRR), and explained NCSSSA's unique role and expertise in state and local FICA coverage and public pension plan matters. She also explained that CRR's reports on state and local Social Security, Medicare, and public pension plans could benefit from NCSSSA's involvement early in the process of designing and drafting their studies.

During the current program year, the Legislative Committee began drafting comments and concerns about the contents of the final report which were to be sent to CRR with a copy being sent to the U.S. Social Security Administration's Acting Commissioner (Carolyn Colvin). Dr. Motza contacted Tom Lussier of the Coalition to find out what they planned to do about updating the Segal reports and/or other follow-up to the CRR report to provide evidence that the conclusions in the CRR report are fallacious. The Coalition prepared a new informational brochure entitled, Retirement Insecurity: The Unintended Consequences of Mandatory Social Security Coverage." A PDF copy of that brochure is included as Appendix B of this report. No other actions, however, were taken by the Coalition.

During the 2014- 2015 program year, Dr. Motza was contacted about a separate matter by Mr. Aubry. He asked for assistance in researching referendum election activities in the states. He had become aware of NCSSSA due to Dr. Motza contacting him prior to the release of the May 2014 report. Because of the latest contact that Mr. Aubry initiated and the chance that CRR could view NCSSSA as a resource for state and local FICA/public pension plan research in the future, committee members decided to put the above mentioned response letter "on hold." The Legislative Committee is currently working with Mr. Aubry on preparing a survey of State Social Security Administrators. This will be a carry-over project for the new Legislative Committee to address during 2015-2016.

C. Completed compilation of comments and suggested edits for the latest edition of the *Federal-State Reference Guide* (IRS Pub. 963) and submitted the suggestion prior to the end of August 2014. **NOTE:** It was agreed by both

President Foltman and President DeVore that the 2013-2014 Legislative Committee members would complete this project. This was necessary to ensure NCSSSA could meet the Internal Revenue Service's (IRS) deadlines for providing feedback on suggested edits and comments. See Appendix C for the recommendations that were submitted to the IRS and their response.

Dr. Motza recently contacted Ms. Rhonda Kingsley of the IRS who assumed the responsibilities for updating Pub. 963 when Mr. Rouleau retired in 2015, but she has not received a response from Ms. Kingsley as of the date of this report. Dr. Motza will follow-up to ensure NCSSSA's input is provided for any updates to the *Guide* that are planned for November 2015.

- D. Reviewed and discussed implications of the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs report entitled "An Analysis of SMART Options: Reinstatement of the Section 218 Option", dated February 2014. See Appendix D for the report's table of contents and executive summary. Followup on this with both El Paso County officials and Mr. Lussier of the Coalition to Preserve Retirement Security will be a carry-over project for the new Legislative Committee to address during 2015-2016.
- 4. Monitored legislative and regulatory activities and publications of interest to NCSSSA members, including:
  - A. Universal Social Security issues. See item # 3.B. in the follow-up/carry-over projects from last program year.
  - B. Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) Proposal introduced by Representatives Brady and Neal (see Appendix E for further information). Ms. Susan Bussman, Social Security Administration's Legislative and Regulatory Relations Director in Baltimore, provided the SSA's Chief Actuary's website link for his office's analysis of the bill: <u>http://www.socialsecurity.gov/OACT/solvency/index.html</u>. H.R. 5697 is the first bill on this list. The analysis includes a thorough description of what the bill would do, as well as an estimate of cost/savings. The bill was reintroduced (H.B. 711) when the new session of Congress convened in January 2015.
  - C. Medicare Opt-in. H.R. 2618 was introduced in the House of Representatives in July 2013. No further action was taken on this by Congress during the 2014-2015 NCSSSA program year.

- 5. Continued active involvement in the Public Pension Network, which began during 2007-2008, after Ms. Barrie Tabin-Berger, Assistant Director, Federal Liaison Center, GFOA, sponsored NCSSSA's membership. The Public Pension Network consists of a group of organizations that lobby Congress and Federal agencies regarding many issues with which NCSSSA members are also concerned. Among participating organizations in the Network, in addition to the GFOA, are: National Conference of Public Employees Retirement Systems (NCPERS), National Association of State Retirement Administrators (NASRA), the National Council on Teacher Retirement (NCTR), National Association of Government Defined Contribution Administrators (NAGDCA), and the National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL). Involvement in the Public Pension Network has proven to be extremely valuable to NCSSSA in two major ways:
  - 1. Ensures that NCSSSA is apprised immediately of any Federal-level developments (Presidential, Congressional, or regulatory) that impact any

aspects of NCSSSA's areas of interest, e.g., Social Security, Medicare, employment taxes, and public pension system requirement oversight.

2. Provides high-profile exposure for NCSSSA on significant national issues when NCSSSA signs on to letters expressing concern or support for proposed actions at the Federal level.

NCSSSA was a signatory on two letters sent by the PPN this year:

- A. U.S. Senate Committee on Finance Tax Reform Working Group on Saving and Investment. The Saving and Investment Working Group had jurisdiction over the tax treatment of capital gains and dividends, financial products, defined benefit pension plans, and private retirement savings accounts. The report is attached to this report and is also available at: <u>file:///C:/Users/qcnu04/Downloads/The%20Savings%20&%20Investment%2</u> <u>OBipartisan%20Tax%20Working%20Group%20Report.pdf</u>. See Appendix I for a copy of the PPN letter, dated April 15, 2015, the final Working Group Report (dated July 2015) and miscellaneous email communications distributed by the PPN during 2014-2015.
- B. Letter dated May 11, 2015, providing comments on IRS Notice 2015-07, which sets forth specific rules and relief to certain participants in Internal Revenue Code §414(d) governmental plans. See Appendix J for a copy of the Notice, the joint letter, and a separate letter, dated May 6, 2015, which was sent to the IRS by NCSSSA President DeVore.

NCSSSA's Legislative Committee will continue to participate in PPN activities and provide the NCSSSA President with any draft letters so he/she can decide if NCSSSA should be a signatory.

- 6. Drafted legislative briefing materials for the NCSSSA leadership team (President Vandee DeVore, First Vice-President Maryann Motza, and Vice-President Designate James Sawyer). The Issues Statement was used by the leadership team during the meetings with U.S. House Ways and Means Committee staff and with representatives from several of the NCSSSA Public Pension Network partners, while participating in the leadership meetings held in Washington, D.C. and Baltimore in March 2015 (see Appendix K for the final that was used during the meetings and for the Action Items that resulted from the meetings).
- 7. At the request of the newly-formed Governing Documents Committee, reviewed the current section of the NCSSSA Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) that applies to the Legislative Committee. Committee members had reviewed the SOP and recommended, and received approval, to update its section of the SOP during 2012-2013, so no additional changes were recommended this program year.

- 8. Provided Legislative Committee feedback to questions posed by the Ad Hoc Name Change Committee. See Appendix L for that series of email exchanges.
- 9. Conducted several miscellaneous activities on behalf of NCSSSA during 2014-2015:
  - A. All Legislative Committee members reviewed the current IRS compliance selfassessment form (Form 14581: <u>http://www.irs.gov/pub/irs-pdf/f14581.pdf</u>) and suggest areas for improvement. Suggestions were provided to President Vandee DeVore and Mr. Dean Conder, both of whom are serving on the Advisory Committee for Tax Exempt and Government Entities (ACT) and were reviewing that and other education and outreach tools currently used by the IRS. The comments were provided by individual committee members, so there is no single document that captured recommendations and comments from the Legislative Committee. The Legislative Committee solicited information from other NCSSSA members on behalf of the ACT Committee. The documents announcing that the request are contained in Appendix M.
  - B. Asked the Leadership Team, (Vandee DeVore, President; Maryann Motza, First Vice President; and James Sawyer, Vice President Designate) to obtain the current list of Section 218 Compliance Risks that have been identified by the IRS as part of their compliance efforts. The latest available list was provided in March 2014. <u>NOTE:</u> This topic was put on the 2015 Annual Conference by the Program Committee, so an update on the risk areas will be available during the conference.
  - C. Conducted an email discussion of the Request for Comments from the Actuarial Standards Board. No action was taken by NCSSSA on preparing and submitting any comments to the ASB, per agreements of Committee members via email exchanges during October 2014.
  - D. Reviewed Ernst and Young's report entitled "2015 Legislative Outlook" that was issued on January 13, 2015 and is available at: <u>file:///C:/Users/qcnu04/Downloads/Legislative%20Update\_WCEY-2015Outlook.pdf</u>.
  - E. Reviewed regular issues of the "Washington Update" that is prepared by Williams & Jensen, PLLC, for the National Conference on Public Employee Retirement Systems (NCPERS).
  - F. Dr. Motza participated in a demonstration and feedback session on September 23, 2014, on the upgraded Public Plans Database that is co-sponsored by the Center for State and Local Government Excellence, the Center for Retirement Research at Boston College, and the National Association of State Retirement Administrators (NASRA). The webinar was to "beta test" revisions to the Public Plans Database that is currently maintained by the CRR,

with sponsorship of SLGE. The revised database now provides expanded userfriendly tools. The revised and updated database is available at: <u>http://crr.bc.edu/data/public-plans-database/</u>.

- G. Discussed the latest status Government Accountability Office (GAO) 2010 Report entitled "Social Security Administration: Management Oversight Needed to Ensure Accurate Treatment of State and Local Government Employees" GAO-10-938: Published: Sep 29, 2010. Publicly Released: Oct 4, 2010. GAO reports that all recommendations have been accomplished by the Social Security Administration and Internal Revenue Service so no further follow-up is planned by the GAO at this time. The final Report and status of recommendations are available at: <u>http://www.gao.gov/products/GAO-10-938.</u>
- H. Reviewed the announcement by the Internal Revenue Service's Tax Exempt and Government Entities Division Announcement 2014-34 Realignment of Technical Work between the Tax Exempt and Government Entities Division and Office of Association Chief Counsel (Tax Exempt and Government Entities). See Appendix N for a copy of that announcement.
- Reviewed the Ogletree-Deakins summary report, dated May 8, 2015, entitled "FICA Tax Student Exemption Resolution: Fifth Circuit Decision About Refunds of FICA Taxes Paid by Medical Residents Stands" and decision issued that was issued July 16, 2014, by the U.S. Court of Appeals' Fifth Circuit in the University of Texas System v. U.S. case. See Appendix O for both the report and the Fifth Circuit's decision.

As chairperson of the Legislative Committee, I want to personally thank the other members (listed on page one of this report) for their contributions and continued support of the efforts of the Committee. Their work and dedication to the Committee was invaluable to ensuring NCSSSA members are kept informed in a timely manner of critical national level regulatory and legislative developments that are of importance to State Administrators and public employers/employees throughout the country and that NCSSSA's voice is heard at the national level on important policy issues.

During our Regional break out session on Monday, July 27, we discussed the following state issues:

**Wyoming:** Police and firefighters, trying to fund the Social Security Administrator position (part of retirement system, other duties as assigned) Can we get a GAO study done? Encourage IRS & SSA to write a letter to the WY Governor and head of the Retirement system. Recognizing the difference for when a referendum needs to be done, or an error mod needs to be done.

<u>Utah:</u> Passed a resolution to hold referendums for covering police and firefighters, dealing with charter school issues – opinion from the IRS specific to one school claiming that they are not a governmental entity, this ruling is in conflict with the Utah AG's office opinion, OGC opinion was requested in 2013, no response has been issued. One town with 3 employees that held a referendum and they cannot find the date that the entity began paying in to SSA, so the referendum cannot be submitted – can a b5 be done?

**Montana:** bi-annual legislative session 2015, updated state law during this session to clean up sections of code, two bills passed, charter schools failed to gain legislation, sharing a computer system with local government services to better track their entities and offer joint educational services, SSA form 1945 – WEP and GPO information

**Colorado:** Legislation from the 70's mandated that the DA's office be covered by 218, subsequently each DA's office entered into a 218 agreement and the elected DA decided that they did not want to participate and law was changed so that the elected DA was now under the state pension plan, argument was presented against this and lost in district court so all elected DA's from that point forward were not covered under 218. Police and Fire pension system because state statute has not been changed to reflect the current Federal law that police and fire are not allowed to be under a state 218 agreement. Working with the fire and police pension assoc. to double check 218 covered administrative positions against FPPA covered positions to ensure compliance with Federal law. Under state pension law for police officers required that every municipality that had a paid police force maintained a pension, but the town marshal was an exception based on time spent on the job, now issues are being brought up where members of the police departments are covered under 218 and not eligible for the pension plan. Funding for Social Security Administrator position/program because funds that had built up have been used by other programs and never reimbursed.

<u>South Dakota:</u> No legislation for charter schools, no new issues with exclusions or coverage

North Dakota: Not present

North Dakota Administrator, Kurt Erhmantraut, arrived after our Regional Caucus.

It was voted to have Amanda Schmitgen remain as the Region VI Vice-President.

Region VII welcomed Armond Joseph and Breyan Foltz to the world of 218 in the SSA's Seattle Regional Office. Melanie Helmick has been named Alaska's new state administrator. And, Washington state has said hello to charter schools!

Budgetary concerns, legislative changes on the state level, the challenge of employer education and outreach with ever-diminishing federal partners' budgets, a need for consistent information and policy application by SSA regional offices throughout our

region, while not unique to this program year, are anticipated to challenge us until we meet next September in Bozeman, MT.
