## Percent Minority: 2013 to 2060

## Summary: 2000 to 2010

- In 2010, just over one-third of the U.S. population reported their race as something other than non-Hispanic White alone.
- Nearly half of the population under 18 years are something other than non-Hispanic White alone.
- Of the 27.3 million people added to the U.S. population between 2000 and 2010, 25.1 million were Hispanic or a race other than White.


## Summary: 2013 to 2060

- The U.S. population is projected to grow more slowly.
- The older population is projected to nearly double, growing from 43 million in 2012 to 84 million in 2050.
- By 2030, one in five Americans will be 65 years or older.
- The United States is projected to become a plurality nation by 2043.
- In 2060, 57.4 percent of the total population and 67.1 percent of the population under 18 is expected to be minority.
