

Pipeline Leak

If you look at 100 9th graders in New York:

- 57 graduate from high school four years later.
- 41 immediately enter college.
- 31 are still in college their sophomore year.
- And of the original 100 students, only **19** receive an associate's degree in three years or a bachelor's degree in six years.

Who Are Our Students?

- High School graduates are declining in all but 18 states.
- By 2018 whites will be the minority of children under the age of 18 in America.
- Most students choose to attend college within 100 miles from home- but through 2019, the number of high school graduates will be flat or decrease in every region except the South.



President Obama's 2020 Strategic Vision and Goals

- 10 million more graduates from community colleges, four-year colleges and universities by 2020 (beyond 2+ million expected due to growth)
 - Create and support opportunities for every American to complete one year or more of higher education or advanced training in his/her lifetime

 "Best educated, most competitive workforce in the world"

Achieving the 2020 College Completion Goal

Increase the U.S. College Degree Attainment Rate from 40 to 60%

- **10 million** additional Americans ages 25-34 with an associate or baccalaureate degree (includes 8 million beyond projected growth).
- **3.7 million** more high school graduates will become college graduates.
- 6.3 million adult learners will become college graduates.

Note: The attainment rate reflects the number of individuals in the population who have attained the degree or diploma. This differs from the graduation/completion rate, which measures the number of individuals within a cohort who graduate or complete their program within a certain amount of time.
